Wine Listening Session Update

Throughout July and August 2019, the OLCC visited several locations throughout Oregon to hear from members of the wine industry.

- Medford, July 17, 2019, 35 attendees
 - Not interested in changing current rules regarding wine labeling
 - ▶ Want to see the wine industry come together to resolve issues
 - Concern over make-up and scope of RAC
- Roseburg, July 29, 2019, 25 attendees
 - Communicated that current rules are working well
 - Expressed interest in using federal content standards except for specific grape varieties
 - Concern over make-up and scope of RAC
 - Consider having sellers of grapes collect and remit tonnage tax from buyers
- McMinnville, August 1, 2019, 60 attendees
 - Concerned about out-of-state entities using Oregon American Viticultural Areas (AVA) and not paying the tonnage tax
- Pendleton, August, 6, 2019, 10 attendees
 - Want clear regulations that work for all parts of the state
 - Concerned about how rule changes may impact small businesses and cross border sales
 - Concern over make-up and scope of RAC



Rules Advisory Committee and Rulemaking for Wine

- OLCC will convene a Rules Advisory Committee (RAC) based on requirements set out in SB 829. The RAC will contain:
 - An odd number of members;
 - Members that have expertise in production and labeling of Oregon wines;
 - Members from various wine growing regions in proportion to the relative acreage used for wine grape production;
 - At least one member from inside the Willamette Valley and one outside of the Willamette Valley; and
- The OLCC will consider nominees of winemaking industry associations or other organizations related to winemaking.
- The RAC will develop recommendations on which wine regions (at minimum Willamette Valley AVA) should use conjunctive labeling of AVAs, on a penalty schedule, and on the use of existing stocks of labels.
