

Community Corrections Budget Impacts

Clackamas, Multnomah, Washington, Lane Counties



Clackamas County

Reduction of \$1.4 Million in State Funding



Potential Cuts:

1. Elimination of 12 positions, including councilors, parole and probation officers and administrative staff
2. Closure of the Clackamas Transition Center – a reentry resource center designed to serve as a bridge between incarceration and community
3. Elimination of critical mentor services contracts and housing resources

Multnomah County



Reduction of \$5.4 Million in State Funding, Community Corrections

Cuts:

1. Elimination of 19 positions, including councillors, parole and probation Officers.
2. Eliminating program for lower risk offenders.
3. Closing jail dorm (73 beds) and eliminating 7.2 corrections officers.
4. Reduction in the number of beds available for adults in custody getting released on Short Term Transitional Leave

Washington County



Reduction of \$1.2 Million in State Funding, Community Corrections

Overview of Program losses:

1. Closure of a 36-bed Substance Abuse program;
2. Contract Recovery & Peer Mentors; and
3. Reduction in the number of subsidy housing beds available for adults in custody getting released on Short Term Transitional Leave

Staff cuts:

12 Community Corrections employees. However, Washington County bridged the gap by temporarily supplementing part of the state's funding shortfall saving six Probation & Parole staff; Net loss 6 positions.
