





All 1 st choices on the ballots are counted. Did a candidate receive 50%+1 votes? If yes, then they win.



HOW IT WORKS




If not, the candidate with the fewest 1st choices is defeated. The ballots for that candidate go to those voters' 2 nd choices. (Note: ONLY the defeated candidate's ballots go to their next choice. Ballots cast for all other candidates continue to count for those candidates.)

HOW IT WORKS


step 3

Did a candidate receive 50%+1 votes? If yes, then they win. If not, repeat Step 2.








VOTER UNDERSTANDING

- Studies show majority of voters knew about RCV, understood it, and used it to rank their preferences.*
 - After having used it, most said they preferred it to the former Runoff system.
- When likely voters in cities using RCV were asked "When you voted in the recent election, how easy was it to understand the voting instructions?"**
 - 2013 Survey: overwhelming majority (90%) in RCV cities found the RCV ballot easy to understand.
 - Similarly, 89% of respondents in RCV cities in California found the RCV ballot easy to understand.




Voter Understanding of Plurality vs. Ranked Choice Voting (2014 Poll)




Percentage notes respondents who understood system, somewhat, very or extremely well.

IMPACT ON TURNOUT

An expansive October 2016 study by University of Missouri-St. Louis (Dr. David Kimball and Joseph Anthony) examines the impact of ranked choice voting (RCV) on voter turnout in 26 American cities across 79 elections.

The UMO study shows that the adoption of RCV is associated with:

- A 10-point increase in voter turnout compared to primary and runoff elections.
- No change in turnout in the General Election.
- No change in the number of error votes (overvotes and undervotes).
- No change in inequities in voter turnout and error votes in Minneapolis.

San Francisco's RCV mayoral election drew a much higher voter turnout than California's statewide election

70%

70% of voters used all 3 of their rankings, while 86% of voters selected 2-3 candidates

Voters were 6x more likely to invalidate their ballot voting for governor (Top Two Primary) than for mayor (RCV)




Time Spent Criticizing Opponents



VOTER SATISFACTION AND SUPPORT


- Eagleton Poll with Professors Tolbert and Donovan, likely voters were asked whether they supported the use of RCV in local elections.
 - The surveys found a majority of all respondents believed RCV should be used in local elections in their city. In cities already using RCV:
 - 2013 survey, 62% of those in RCV cities supported its use in their local elections;
 - In cities that use plurality voting methods:
 - 2014 survey in California, 54% supported the introduction of RCV into their local city.


New York City voted 74% to enact Ranked Choice Voting in November 2019
