Dear Oregon Senate Environmental & Natural Resources Committee:

I want to submit my public comments supporting a strong cap & invest policy, such as L.C. 19, with improvements for climate change action.

For 25 years, I was a seasonal park ranger at Crater Lake National Park. I loved this job. Sadly, while working there, I saw the impacts of climate change with a diminishing snowpack and more intense wildfire season. The smoke from the wildfires got so bad in my last summers there in 2015, 2016 and 2017, that I saw it have a very bad impact on the local economy of southern Oregon when visitors were not coming to the park because they didn't want to breathe the smoke. Local mom & pop businesses such as campgrounds, restaurants and motels saw their business during this peak season dry up as a result.

Thus, I urge you to pass strong and effective climate legislation in the upcoming 2020 OR short legislative session, such as L.C. 19.

In addition, I ask you to please make these changes to the bill:

- Natural Gas: All gas utilities and big users must be under the cap, pay for their pollution and be incentivized to reduce emissions.

- Transportation: We accept the political reasoning for a geographic phase-in, but it's current form is un-workable. Even more important, any such phase-in must cover the entire state by a specified date.

- Investments: All funds allocated to impacted communities must have strong oversight including representation by those communities to ensure those funds are used to combat climate change.
