COVID-19 Dental Timeline

- March 15th: ODA called upon dentists to cease elective care and donate PPE
- **March 19th:** Executive Order 20-10
- *May 1st*: Executive Order 20-22: Elective non-urgent care allowed to resume
 - Announced 4/23: dentists start to book patients
 - OHA Guidance released 4/29
 - OHA Clarifying FAQs released 5/6
- Today: Many dental offices unable to resume nonurgent care





Regulatory Burdens and Unclarity

- OHA uses the term "should" in guidance
- Dentists "should" use fit-tested N-95 masks
- Limited flexibility
- CDC Recommendations, OSHA Requirements, OHA Guidance, FDA Changes
- Changes/Updates in Requirements





PPE Insufficiencies

- N95s/KN95s seemingly required, but unavailable
- Dentists purchased KN95s- removed from FDA list
- Fit testing expensive







Economic Impact on Dental Practices

- Small Practices Hit the Hardest
- Many Closed for over Two Months
- Phased in Reopening
- Costly PPE Purchasing
- Keeping Dental Team Members Employed
 - 37.6% fully paying staff (HPI data)
 - 43.6% partially paying staff (HPI data)
- Limited Revenue Coming in





Emergency Care

- Oregon dentists ensuring dental emergencies do not present at ER
- 96% of surveyed offices available for emergency care
- ODA Emergency Referral Process
