### **GENERAL FUND BUDGET REDUCTION EXERCISE**

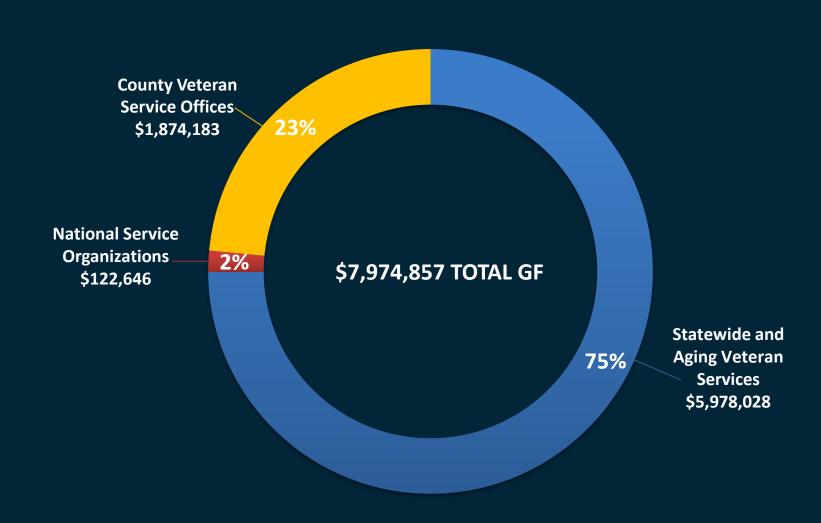
#### **PROCESS**

- Anticipated General Fund revenue shortfall
- Request from DAS CFO to plan for potential allotment reductions
- Each agency to provide a budget reduction plan up to 8.5% of biennial General Fund budget
- Equal reductions across all appropriations

### APPROACH TO GENERAL FUNDS REDUCTION

#### PRIMARY AREAS FOR REDUCTIONS

#### 8.5% REDUCTIONS ODVA OPERATIONS (\$508,132)

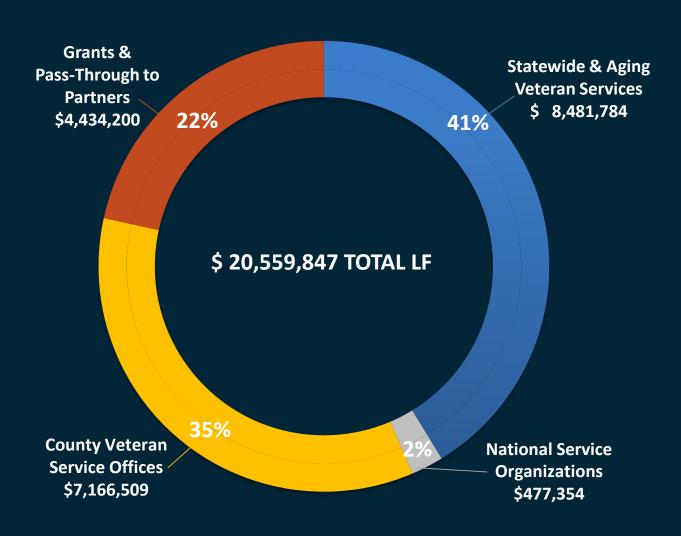
- Savings from previously vacant positions
- Savings from maintaining a current vacant position
- Reduction in funding for services and supplies (i.e., travel, outreach, office supplies)

#### 8.5% REDUCTION TO VETERAN SERVICES PASS THROUGH

- County Veteran Service Offices (\$159,305)
- National Service Offices (\$10,425)
