# ADPC OVERVIEW

- AN INDEPENDENT STATE AGENCY CREATED BY THE LEGISLATURE
  - IMPROVE THE EFFECTIVENESS AND EFFICIENCY OF SUBSTANCE MISUSE PREVENTION, TREATMENT, AND RECOVERY SERVICES FOR ALL OREGONIANS
- POLICY BOARD
  - 19 MEMBERS, 16 VOTING.
  - APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR AND CONFIRMED BY THE SENATE
  - CHARGED WITH DEVELOPING A COMPREHENSIVE STATEWIDE STRATEGIC PLAN
  - IDENTIFIES PRIORITIES FOR PREVENTION, TREATMENT, AND RECOVERY SUPPORTS

# THE PLAN

- REVIEWED HUNDREDS OF PAGES OF DOCUMENTS AND CONDUCTED LISTENING VISITS AROUND THE STATE
- FOCUS ON MEASURABLE IMPROVEMENTS
  - HEALTH, SOCIAL, AND ECONOMIC INDICATORS
  - ESTABLISHES PROCESSES FOR MONITORING AND REPORTING PROGRESS
- ESTABLISHES PROCESSES FOR COORDINATING STATE AGENCY EFFORTS
  - STRENGTHENING STATE LEADERSHIP, CAPACITY, AND USE OF EFFECTIVE PRACTICES
- INCLUDES STRATEGIES AND ACTIVITIES
- ESTABLISHES A BASELINE FOR CURRENT STATE SPENDING
- DEVELOPS PROCESSES FOR MONITORING CHANGES IN SPENDING AND REINVESTING COST SAVINGS OVER TIME

# JOINT RECOMMENDATIONS

1. EXPAND RESIDENTIAL CAPACITY FOR PARENTS TO RECEIVE TREATMENT WHILE CARING FOR THEIR CHILDREN.
2. EXPAND RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT CAPACITY FOR ADOLESCENTS.
3. SUD AFFECTED PARENTS WITH CHILDREN IN SUBSTITUTE CARE WOULD BE CONSIDERED A PRIORITY POPULATION, THUS GOING TO THE HEAD OF THE LINE FOR TREATMENT AND RECOVERY SERVICES.
4. FOR INTACT FAMILIES, EXPAND CHILD CARE OPTIONS SO PARENT CAN RECEIVE TREATMENT WITHOUT LEAVING THEIR CHILDREN.
