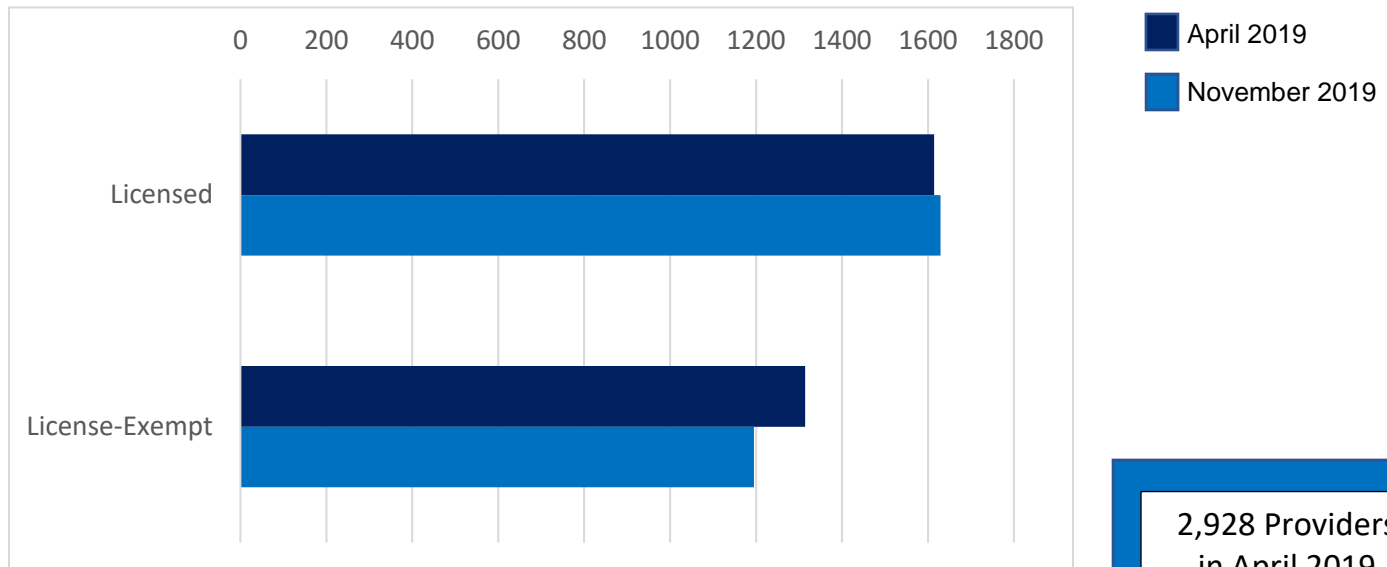


Employment Related Day Care (ERDC) Number of and Funding for Licensed and Exempt Providers in 2019 (April and November snapshot)

The graphs below provide a look at the number of and funding for ERDC providers.

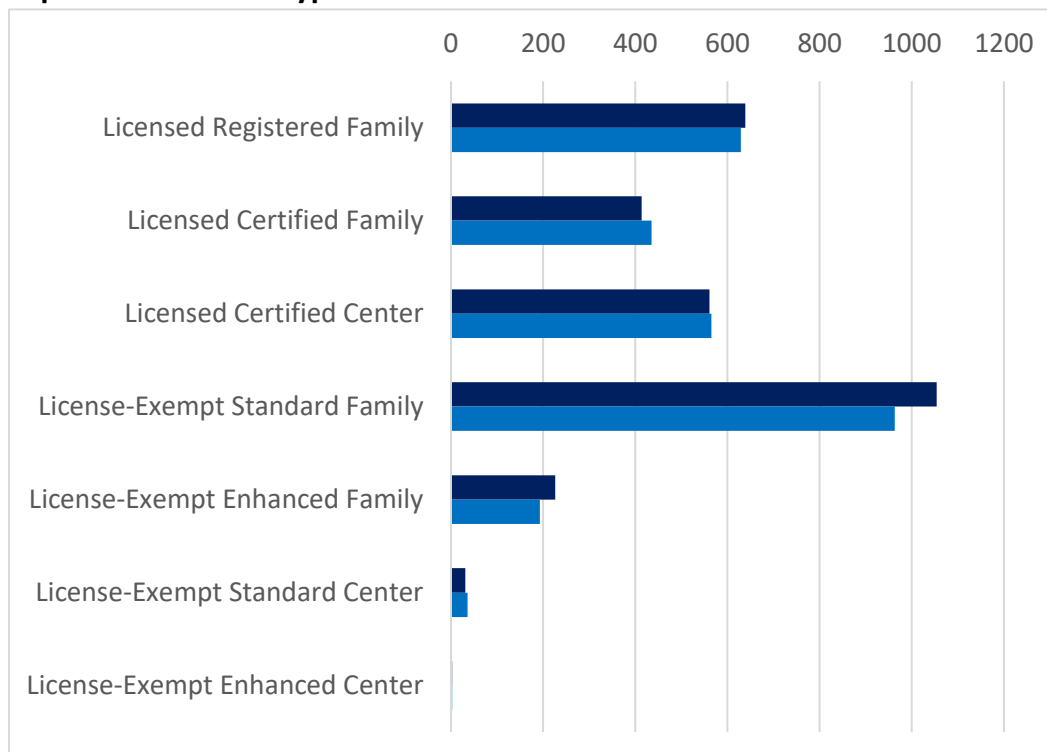
Number of ERDC Providers

Expanded Provider Types: Number of ERDC Providers



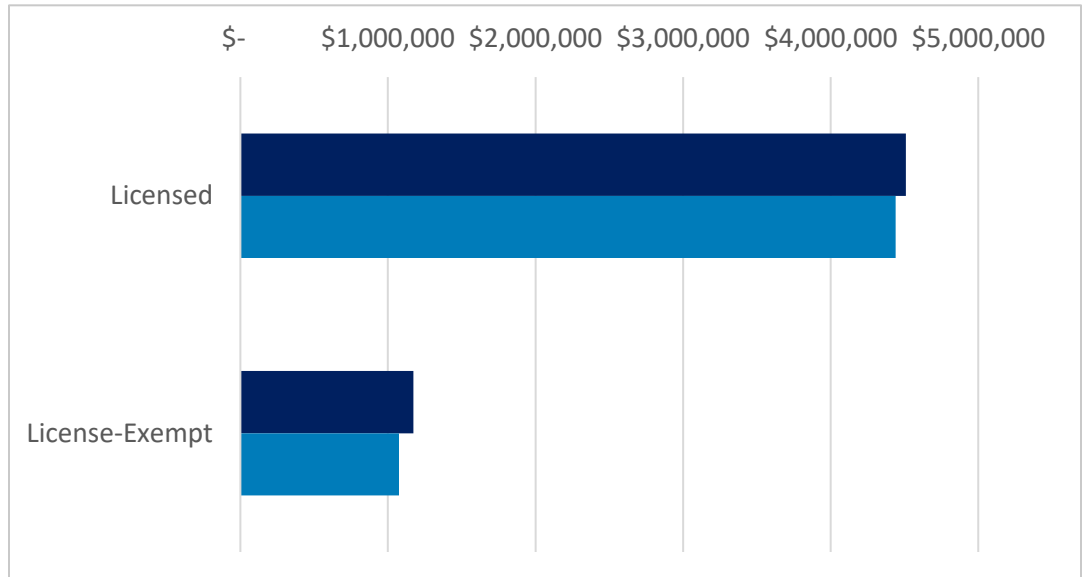

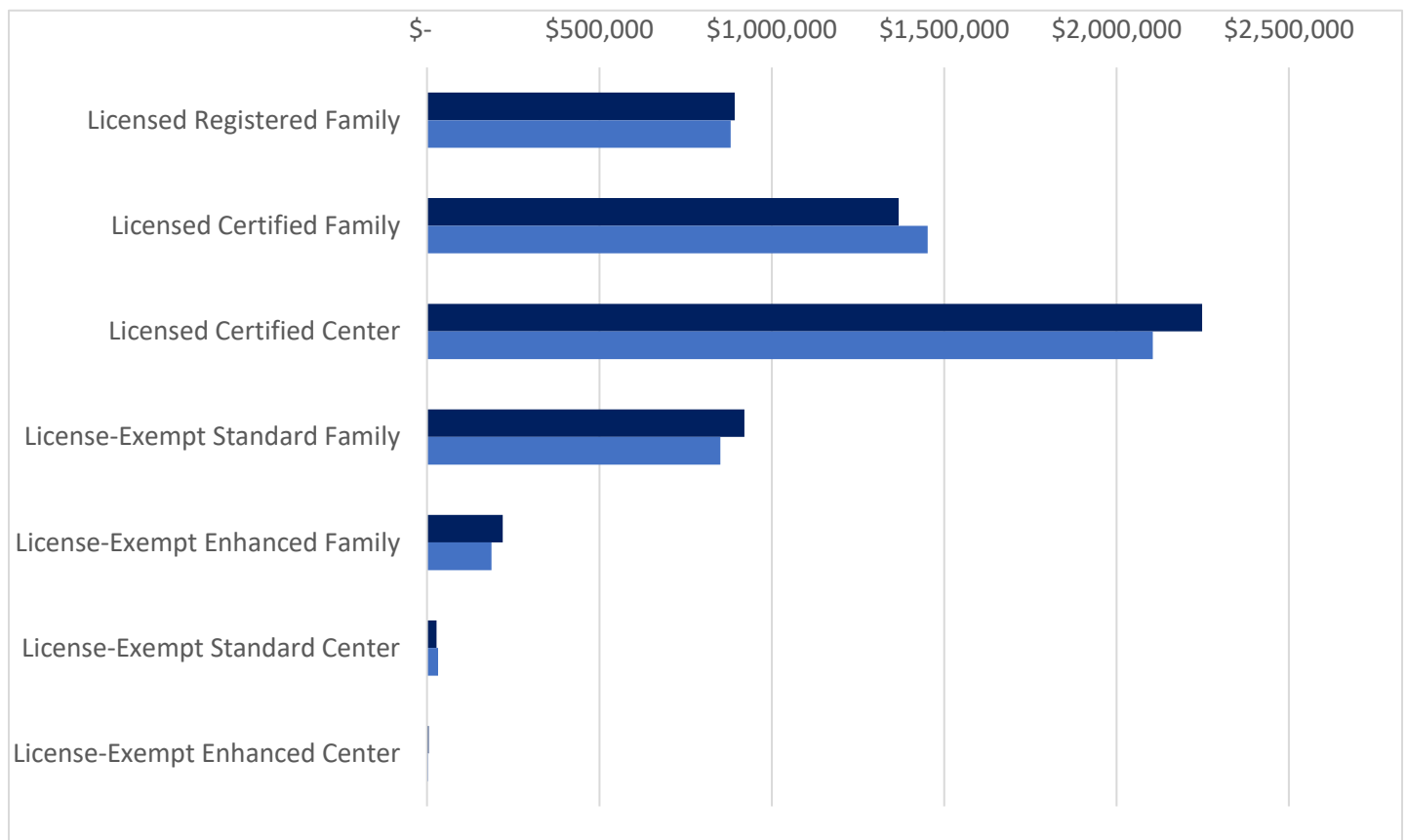

Descriptions of each Provider Type:

Note: Language is adapted from OAR 461-155-0150.

Licensed Registered Family applies to child care provided in the provider's own home when the provider meets criteria established by the Office of Child Care. These families can care for a maximum of 10 children.

Licensed Certified Family applies to child care provided in a residential dwelling that is certified by the Office of Child Care as a Certified Family Home. To earn this designation, the facility must be inspected, and both provider and facility are required to meet certain standards not required of a registered family provider. These families can care for a maximum of 16 children.

Licensed Certified Center applies to child care provided in a center that is certified by the Office of Child Care or participating in the Alternative Pathway program through the Office of Child Care. These are the larger child care facilities.

License-Exempt Standard Family applies to child care provided in the provider's own home or in the home of the child when the provider does not qualify for the enhanced rate. This is commonly known as Family Friends and Neighbors (FFN) providers.

License-Exempt Enhanced Family applies to child care provided in the provider's own home or in the home of the child when the provider meets the training requirements of the Oregon Registry, established by the Oregon Center for Career Development in Childhood Care and Education. These are also FFN providers who have taken additional training to get a higher rate.

License-Exempt Standard Center applies to child care provided in a facility that is not located in a residential dwelling and is exempt from Office of Child Care Certification rules (see [OAR 414-300-0000](#)). These are often after-school programs, parks and recreation programs, or license-exempt preschools.

License-Exempt Enhanced Center applies to child care provided in an exempt center whose staff meet the training requirements of the Oregon Registry established by the Oregon Center for Career Development in Childhood Care and Education. Eligibility to receive the enhanced center rate for care provided in an exempt center is subject to extra requirements. Not a common classification.
