## **OREGON STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY**

The Governor has appointed the following individuals to the Oregon State Board of Pharmacy subject to Senate confirmation.<sup>1</sup>

## **Appointees**

Rachael DeBarmore of Keizer, Reappointment Ian Doyle of Portland, New Appointment

#### **Term**

DeBarmore: July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2024 Doyle: July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2024

#### Statement of Economic Interest<sup>2</sup>

# **Statutory Requirements**<sup>3</sup>

The board consists of nine members appointed by the Governor and subject to confirmation by the Senate.<sup>4</sup> All members of the board must be residents of this state. Members serve four-year terms and at the pleasure of the Governor.

Five members must be licensed pharmacists (AYOUB, BEAMAN, **DEBARMORE**, **DOYLE**, LINARES, MURRAY). These members may be selected by the Governor from a list of three to five nominees for each vacancy, submitted by a task force assembled by the Oregon State Pharmacy Association to represent all interested pharmacy groups. These members must be licensed and in good standing, be engaged in the practice of pharmacy in this state, and have five years of experience in the practice of pharmacy in Oregon after licensure.

Two members must be licensed pharmacy technicians (DUFOUR, VIPPERMAN). These members must be licensed and in good standing, engaged in the performance of duties as a pharmacy technician in this state, and have at least three years of experience performing the duties of a pharmacy technician in this state after licensure.

Two must be members of the public who are not licensed pharmacists or a spouse, domestic partner, child, parent, or sibling of a pharmacist (LOGAN, WATSON). These members must have attained the age of majority, may not be current or former members of the profession of pharmacy, may not have and have never had any material financial interest in the providing of pharmacy service, and may not have engaged in any activity directly related to the practice of pharmacy.

## **Duties and Authority**

The board administers licensing for pharmacists, technicians, interns, and multiple types of drug outlets and regulates the manufacture and distribution of drugs.<sup>5</sup>

#### The board must:6

- exercise the duties, powers and authority necessary to enforce the provisions administered by the board;
- annually print and circulate copies of any changes in the laws relating to pharmacy, controlled substances, drugs, and poisons, and the rules adopted to enforce the laws, and establishment of reasonable charges for the copies;
- · appoint advisory committees;
- determine within 30 days prior to the beginning of each state fiscal year the fees to be collected for specified services;
- exercise control and regulation of the practice of pharmacy in the state through the administration of licensing, standards, and discipline;
- provide for the regulation of medications, drugs, devices, and other materials;
- elect from its members a president and vice president and such other officers as it deems appropriate and necessary to the conduct of its business;
- meet at least once every three months to transact its business; and
- make, adopt, amend, and repeal such rules as may be deemed necessary by the board for the proper administration and enforcement of its authority.

# The board may:7

- join professional organizations and associations organized exclusively to promote the improvement of the standards of the practice of pharmacy for the protection of the health and welfare of the public and whose activities assist and facilitate the work of the board:
- require surety bonds as it deems necessary to guarantee the performance and discharge of the duties of any officer or employee receiving and disbursing funds;

- receive and expend funds from parties other than the state under specified circumstances:
- assign to each drug outlet under its jurisdiction a uniform state number, coordinated where possible with all other states that adopt the same uniform numbering system;
- investigate and gather evidence concerning alleged violations of the provisions administered by the board;
- administer oaths, issue notices and subpoenas in the name of the board, enforce subpoenas, hold hearings, and perform such other acts as are reasonably necessary to carry out its duties;
- employ persons in positions or capacities as it deems necessary to properly conduct the business of the board and its fulfillment of responsibilities; and
- require fingerprints for the purpose of requesting a criminal records check of a person
  who is applying for a license or certificate that is issued by the board, applying for
  renewal of a license or certificate that is issued by the board, or under investigation by
  the board.
