Oregon Criminal Justice Commission

19 June 2020

1. NATURE OF THE REQUEST

Representative Bynum requested data concerning arrest and conviction rates by various demographics on the following ORS codes:

- ORS 162.247 – Interfering with a peace officer
- ORS 166.023 – Disorderly conduct in the first degree
- ORS 166.025 – Disorderly conduct in the second degree

The race categories presented have a racial correction algorithm applied to mitigate race/ethnicity reporting issues within criminal justice data sources.¹

*For multiple tables, totals may not match across tables as expected due to some missing values in the underlying data. These missing values are few and any effect they have on results is not substantive.

2. DATA REQUEST RESULTS

Arrests:

The arrest data were queried from the Law Enforcement Data System (LEDS), which includes arrests where the person was fingerprinted. The tables include arrest events with at least one charge for the statutes listed. There may be other crimes associated with the arrest as well.

Convictions from municipal or justice courts are not included. The tables include cases with at least one conviction for the statutes listed. There could be other charges and convictions included in the case.

Due to the fact that Disorderly conduct in the first degree resulted in very few convictions from 2010-2019 (see following tables), not all demographics and breakdowns are given for this charge.

RDRs:

To examine racial disparities, the table below displays the raw differential representation (RDR) metric. A positive RDR indicates that a group is overrepresented relative to Whites, while a zero value or negative value indicates that a group is either equal to or underrepresented relative to Whites, respectively.

Substantively, the RDR represents the reduction in arrests or convictions that would be required to reach parity with Whites given population differences across race. As such, the RDR value for Whites is always zero because it is the group to which others are compared. Positive RDRs for non-White racial groups indicate that a reduction equal to that number is necessary to bring the group in line with Whites. For example, from the table below, there would need to be a statewide reduction of 249 Black arrests in 2019 for interfering with a peace officer to bring their arrest rates in line with White arrest rates.

Releases (Pretrial):

The data in Tables 29-30 summarize information from a pretrial data set based on hearing-level court data kept by the Oregon Judicial Department from 2017 to present. Data summarized here are for the years 2017-2019. The original data set is at the hearing level, rather than the charge level, and thus summarizes the most-serious charge on each case. Therefore, the only cases summarized below have a most-serious charge of Disorderly conduct in the first degree, Disorderly conduct in the second degree, or Interference with a peace officer. Further, bail information is inconsistently tracked in the court data, but release event information is more reliable, and thus we only summarize this release event information in these tables.

The columns in Tables 29-30 represent the proportion of individuals of each race/ethnicity group with a most serious charge of Disorderly conduct in the first degree, Disorderly conduct in the second degree, or Interference with a peace officer that received each type of release at some point during the pretrial period. Individuals in the “Multiple” category had multiple types of release events identified during the pretrial period.² Table 29 summarizes this information statewide, whereas Table 30 summarize this information for only the metro area counties (Multnomah, Washington, and Clackamas Counties).
