Any talk of police reform should include public education on how to safely interact with the police.

It appears to me that most of the lethal situations involve actions by people which are not

appropriate or cause the police to view it as threatening behavior. This is not to say that there is

not ever a case of over reaction by police. However, I have never in my long life ever seen or

heard of any education on how to act with the police. Not once. Some of us have common sense

and use it in a polite and non-threatening way when necessary. And some people do not use good

common sense or they like to aggravate police officers. Or they have done something wrong and

get belligerent. Also, how many police get killed every year compared to the public? Get that

statistic out there. It is not like there is no risk for the police. Just concentrating on the police

use of force is not going to cut it.
