My name is Chris Smith, I currently reside in Albany, Oregon. I wanted to let you know you how important a single payer healthcare system is to me and our state.

When I was 16 my mom died of lung cancer, upon her death I was stuck with the bill, taking most of what I could have used for college away in any inheritance I would have received. At 17 I started to volunteer as a Firefighter/EMT and I've served our state since then.

In my career of 7 years serving in EMS, I am constantly reminded of our failed healthcare system that values profit over human life. I see fear in patients eyes knowing that their life may be saved by interventions taken that day, but knowing, that they'll never be free of the debt incurred to save their life.

When the U.S. started the social security program we led the world in expanding our social safety net, placing value on human life. Now sadly, most of the world has passed us up on a single-payer healthcare system.
