I am writing in support of the package of legislative concepts under discussion before this committee: LC 742, LC 743, LC 745, LC 751, LC 761, LC 762, and LC 763. I feel they are actionable, specific, and a decent start to real transformation of policing in Oregon.

Since the start of the protests in the wake of the killing of George Floyd, I have sporadically joined and each time I have learned more both about the importance of this movement and the long-term nature of the organizing. I have also seen and experienced first hand the over-reaction by law enforcement--or what I assumed to be law enforcement as they were, at times, not clearly identified.

I have been tear-gassed for the first time in my life. I've been to many protests and demonstrations over many topics.
