The forced shut down has caused damage to my business that has put me into a situation where I am looking at revenues back 15 years. I have lost 50% of my customers. I have not received a salary as the owner since February and don't anticipate that coming back for at least a year, my personal income is gone and is the only way I have any hope of keeping my business above water. The fact that the Governor confiscated our property for 2 months and has driven our business away through scare tactics has been devastating. Every business who was forced to close in all honesty should be getting a tax refund from the state & county property taxes for the closure and the future losses.

The COVID-19 crisis has impacted my business enormously. My sales are down because of the government-ordered shut down. The truth is that I have struggled to keep staff and recover from the shut down. Disconnecting from the federal CARES Act will only make it worse for my family and my business.

Congress passed the bipartisan CARES Act to help struggling businesses, those who adhered to shut down orders or saw a steep decline in sales. This partisan move by the Oregon Legislature isn't right, and it will make it harder for businesses to put people back to work.

Like many businesses, my biggest issue right now is liquidity, and disconnecting from the CARES Act harms businesses like mine who are just trying to make ends meet. What I need right now is help from leaders like you. I can't believe you are considering something like the CARES Act disconnect in LC 2, which will cost me cash when I need it most.

Please support local businesses, and maintain the integrity of the federal CARES Act relief in Oregon. My ability to recover from this pandemic depends on support from the state legislature, and LC 2 will only make it harder to come back from this crisis.
