resources from other states to respond








Preparation for the Wind Event

OSFM-2020 Fire Season – By the Numbers

Response:

- 57 Oregon task forces/strike teams
- 8 EMAC task forces from 5 states: UT, ID, MN, ND, WA
- > 113 Oregon fire agencies
- Approx. 300 pieces of fire apparatus
- Approx. 650 Oregon fire personnel assigned
- Local extended response

Loss:


- 9 confirmed fatalities
- > 172,427 threatened structures
 - \$43,463,314,807 estimated value of saved residences
- > 2,267 residences lost
- > 1,556 other buildings lost

\$ 15,000,000




OSFM Mobilizations
