OREGON VOLUNTEERS COMMISSION FOR VOLUNTARY ACTION AND SERVICE

The Governor has appointed the following individuals to the Oregon Volunteers Commission for Voluntary Action and Service subject to Senate confirmation.¹

Appointees

Statement of Economic Interest²

Not required.

Statutory Requirements³

The commission consists of at least 15 and not more than 25 members appointed by the Governor and subject to confirmation by the Senate.⁴ The members of the commission must be citizens of this state who have a proven commitment to community service and who have a demonstrated interest in fostering and nurturing citizen involvement as a strategy for strengthening communities and promoting the ethic of service in all sectors of this state.⁵

Membership must include:

- an individual with experience in educational, training and development needs of youth, particularly disadvantaged youth (**CRUZ**);
- an individual with experience in promoting involvement of older adults in service and volunteerism (SCHUBERT);
- a representative of community-based agencies or organizations within this state (FIELDMAN);
- the Deputy Superintendent of Public Instruction or designee;
- a representative of local governments in this state (**McAFEE**);
- a representative of local labor unions in this state (EDWARDS);
- a representative of business (CORNELIUS);
- a person at least 16, but not more than 25, years of age who is a participant or supervisor in a national service program (**ALTAMIRANO**; BARNES; BUCKLAND); and
- a representative of a national service program (CUMBERBATCH; TODD).

Membership may also include individuals from the following groups:

- educators (**VILLEGAS**);
- experts in the delivery of human, educational, environmental, or public safety services to communities and individuals (BRITO; DEIZ; JONES; PALSHIKAR; RIX; SNEAD);
- members of Native American tribes;
- at-risk youths who are out of school; and
- entities that receive assistance under the Domestic Volunteer Service Act of 1973 (WESSELS).

In making appointments of members, the Governor shall ensure that no more than 50 percent of the appointed members are from the same political party and no more than 25 percent of the appointed members are state employees.

The commission must select a commission member as chairperson and another as vice chairperson, for terms, and with duties and powers necessary for the performance of the functions of those offices, as the commission determines.⁶ A majority of the members of the commission constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business. The commission must meet at least once every three months and at the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the commission.

Duties and Authority

The Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS) is the federal agency that leads service, volunteering, and grant-making efforts in the United States under the Americorps and Senior Corps programs.⁷ States that establish a Service Commission are eligible to receive grants through those programs. The commission is responsible for developing a

comprehensive national service plan and administering national and community service programs in the state.⁸

The commission must:⁹

- develop programs and provide oversight and administration of programs granted to this state by the CNCS under the National and Community Service Trust Act of 1993;
- prepare state applications to the Corporation for National and Community Service for financial assistance for state-based service programs;
- develop projects, training methods, curriculum materials, and other materials and activities related to state service programs that receive assistance directly from the Corporation for National and Community Service;
- engage citizens in service and strengthen communities and create statewide access for all Oregon citizens to a variety of volunteer opportunities;
- encourage youth and young adults to engage in their communities through voluntary action;
- promote recognition of volunteerism and service into the daily operation of public, private and nonprofit sectors throughout the state by promoting a statewide volunteer recognition plan open to all sectors and assisting efforts by Oregon communities to encourage citizen involvement in volunteerism;
- biennially submit a report to the Governor and the Legislative Assembly which: details commission activities during the preceding two years; reviews and summarizes the content of reports accepted by the commission on behalf of the Governor; assesses the state of national service in Oregon; and contains specific recommendations for any additional legislation the commission deems necessary to carry out the purpose of the Oregon Volunteer and Community Service Act or to improve the effectiveness or efficiency of the commission;
- identify goals to develop and facilitate the initiation of public and private entity programs that will encourage and reward citizen participation and volunteerism; and
- adopt a set of recommended best practices for use by organizations and entities in screening volunteers and establish and maintain an outreach program regarding the screening of volunteers.

The commission may:¹⁰

- establish advisory and technical committees as the commission considers necessary to aid and advise the commission in the performance of commission functions; and
- apply for and accept grants, contributions and assistance from any federal, state or local government agency and any foundation, individual, or organization.
