## STATE BOARD OF CHIROPRACTIC EXAMINERS

The Governor has appointed the following individuals to the State Board of Chiropractic Examiners subject to Senate confirmation.<sup>1</sup>

## **Appointees**

Karen Baranick of Clackamas; New Appointment Lori Schmidt of Coos Bay; New Appointment

## Statement of Economic Interest<sup>2</sup>

Not required.

## **Statutory Requirements**<sup>3</sup>

The board consists of seven members appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate.<sup>4</sup> All members must be residents of this state. Of the members of the board:

- five must be chiropractors who have practiced chiropractic in this state for five years prior to appointment (ALLEY; BARANICK; KNECHT; VERMILLION; WAGGONER); and
- two must be members of the public who are not chiropractors or a spouse, domestic partner, child, parent, or sibling of a chiropractor (SCHMIDT; TAYLOR).

Members are selected by the Governor from a list of three to five nominees submitted by any professional organization representing chiropractors. Members serve three-year terms and at the pleasure of the Governor. A member must be removed immediately if, during the member's term, the member:

is not a resident of this state;

- has three consecutive unexcused absences from meetings; or
- is not a licensed chiropractor, or a retired chiropractor who was a licensed chiropractor in good standing at the time of retirement, if the member was appointed to serve as a chiropractor.

The board must annually elect a president, a vice president and a secretary-treasurer from its membership.<sup>5</sup> The board must meet during the months of January and July each year on such days and at such times as may be found necessary for the performance of its duties.<sup>6</sup>

## **Duties and Authority**

The board protects the public by regulating the practice of chiropractic in this state. The board must:<sup>7</sup>

- adopt a seal which is affixed to all licenses issued by it;
- adopt such rules as it deems proper and necessary for the administration and performance of its work;
- adopt a schedule of minimum educational requirements, which shall be without prejudice or discrimination as to the different colleges teaching chiropractic; and
- appoint and form peer review committees to evaluate complaints against chiropractic physicians.

#### The board may:8

- upon receipt of a complaint, make investigations, administer oaths, take affidavits, summon witnesses, and require the production of evidence, documents and records pertaining to the complaint;
- take testimony as to matters pertaining to its duties;
- adopt necessary and proper rules to establish standards and tests to determine the moral, intellectual, educational, scientific, technical and professional qualifications of applicants for licenses to practice in this state;
- adopt necessary and proper rules to enforce appropriate statutory provisions and to exercise general supervision over the practice of chiropractic within this state;
- adopt necessary and proper rules to establish standards and procedures for certifying chiropractic assistants as qualified to provide physiotherapy, electrotherapy or hydrotherapy under the direction of a chiropractic physician, and to establish continuing education requirements as a condition of maintaining such certification;
- adopt necessary and proper rules to establish standards for the use of ancillary personnel;
- issue, deny, suspend and revoke licenses and limited licenses, assess costs of proceedings and place persons on probation;
- without the necessity of prior administrative proceedings or hearing and entry of an order or at any time during such proceedings if they have been commenced, institute

- proceedings to enjoin the practice of any person operating in violation of applicable laws;
- make its personnel and facilities available to other regulatory agencies of this state, or other bodies interested in the development and improvement of the practice of chiropractic in this state, upon such terms and conditions for reimbursement as are agreed to by the board and the other agency or body;
- determine the chiropractic schools, colleges and institutions and the training acceptable
  in connection with licensing under this chapter and approve residency, internship and
  other training programs carried on by chiropractic schools, colleges or institutions or
  chiropractic facilities;
- prescribe the time, place, method, manner, scope and subjects of license examinations;
- prescribe all forms that it considers appropriate, and require the submission of photographs and relevant personal history data by applicants for licenses to practice chiropractic in this state;
- for the purpose of requesting a state or nationwide criminal records check, require each applicant for a license or certification, or renewal of a license or certification, to be fingerprinted;
- administer oaths, issue notices and subpoenas in the name of the board, enforce subpoenas, hold hearings, and perform such other acts as are reasonably necessary to carry out its duties; and
- establish specialty certificate requirements within the practice of chiropractic, adopt rules applicable to specialty certification and require specialty certification for chiropractic physicians engaging in practices identified by the board as requiring specialty certification.
