
Who is most affected by the economic crisis?

Quick Facts:

1 in 3 Lane County renters spend more than half their income on housing.

The most common cause of eviction in the US is non-payment of rent.

Women of color are disproportionately affected by eviction.

As of March 2020 over 4,000 unduplicated people in Lane County were counted as homeless.



A Looming Crisis

The Federal eviction moratorium expired on July 25th.

CARES Act extra unemployment benefits also expired on July 25th.

Oregon's eviction moratorium will expire on September 30th.

Self-employed and gig-workers were unable to file until April 28th.

In June in Lane County there were 13,048 continued claims but 21,268 reported as unemployed.

People with low incomes are experiencing reduced income without job-loss.

Many immigrants may not be eligible or have particular challenges getting assistance.

Many need to get out of rental agreements not written for a global pandemic.
