## Re: Project Turnkey Administration

To the Co-Chairs of the Emergency Board:

I am writing to confirm that Oregon Community Foundation is willing to serve as the fiscal administrator of funds for Project Turnkey, an endeavor to help communities around the state acquire motels/hotels for immediate use as non-congregate shelter.

If funds are allocated, OCF will provide fiscal oversight and due diligence to administer grants to eligible applicants (local entities including cities, counties, housing authorities, tribal communities, nonprofit organizations--- or co-applicants comprised of two entities) for the acquisition of motels/hotels for use as non-congregate shelter. OCF will support the work of an Advisory Committee in reviewing appropriate properties and in ensuring that due diligence is completed on each project as part the Advisory Committee's grant recommendations.

An Advisory Committee will be formed to guide the application and selection process. The Advisory Committee will be structured to include: Local government (Association of Oregon Counties, League of Oregon Cities); Fiscal Lead/Program Manager (OCF); State agency partners (Oregon Housing & Community Services, Oregon Emergency Management); Affordable Housing partners (Hacienda CDC); and partners representing Homeless Service Providers, Rural Communities, and Racial Equity expertise.

Project Turnkey is poised to provide 1,000 units to shelter some of the most vulnerable members of our communities. The program aims to ensure equitable distribution of Project Turnkey funds throughout the state. Immediately, these facilities will be used for non-congregate shelter. In the long term, these facilities will be assets for communities as shelter, transitional housing, permanent supportive housing, or other affordable housing as determined by local needs. If an insufficient number of suitable, high-quality projects that fit the selection criteria are identified through a Request-for-Application (RFA) process, remaining funds will be returned to the State General Fund at the end of the biennium, pending any funds held back for designated operational needs.
