Oregon deserves an alerts and warnings system that is resilient, interoperable and is capable of alerting Oregonians across a wide variety of communications methods. OR-ALERT is such as system.

If approved and implemented, the OR-ALERT System will:

- Provide a robust, state-of the-art alerting system available to all Oregonians
- Allow neighboring jurisdictions and the state to see when an alert is sent, thereby increasing situational awareness and providing early warning capabilities.
- Create seamless alerting interoperability between county emergency managers when mutual aid is requested.
- Provide notifications across the widest possible set communications methods.
- Provide alerting capability to those jurisdictions without any.
- Be capable of sending "Opt In" messages as well as emergency alerts
- Support multiple languages and vulnerable populations
- Ensure that the public only has to "Opt In" to one system anywhere in Oregon.
- Leverage the enterprise's buying power and lower the price of alerting per citizen and make better, more efficient use of tax payer dollars.
- Preserve lives of Oregonians

The OR-ALERT system is desperately needed to assist in responding to the COVID-19 Pandemic, wildfires, and other emergencies as soon as possible. I strongly urge you to consider adopting the system.
