### **SUMMARY**

Urges Congress to enact legislation implementing internal Immigration and Customs Enforcement policy prohibiting enforcement actions in sensitive locations.

1	JOINT MEMORIAL
2	To the President of the United States, the Senate and the House of Repre-
3	sentatives of the United States of America, in Congress assembled, and
4	the United States Secretary of Homeland Security:
5	We, your memorialists, the Eighty-first Legislative Assembly of the State
6	of Oregon, in legislative session assembled, respectfully represent as follows:
7	Whereas 1 in 12 children in Oregon are United States citizens living with
8	at least one undocumented family member—more than 70,000 children; and
9	Whereas the future of Oregon is connected to the health, well-being and
10	education of children in immigrant families; and
11	Whereas immigrant families contribute to the economy, with undocu-
12	mented workers across major industries contributing over \$30 billion in fed-
13	eral and state taxes; and
14	Whereas children in stable families can thrive, but separation from par-
15	ents, especially during early childhood, has lasting impacts on children's
16	growing brains; and
17	Whereas the stress caused by fear of being separated from parents puts
18	children's growth and development at risk; and
19	Whereas deportation of parents often causes emotional distress, poor
20	physical and mental health and poverty for children; and

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- Whereas fear of deportation of self, family members and friends adversely
- 2 affects enrollment in critical children's health and development supports,
- 3 including the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program and health, edu-
- 4 cation and housing programs among documented and undocumented immi-
- 5 grants alike; and
- 6 Whereas early care and education programs report decreased enrollment,
- 7 trouble filling empty spaces, decreased parental participation and drops in
- 8 attendance due to fears of deportation; and
- 9 Whereas fear of deportation increases distrust of local, state and federal
- 10 law enforcement throughout a child's life, while protection from deportation
- 11 increases community safety; and
- Whereas Black immigrants and their children are more likely to be im-
- 13 pacted by immigration enforcement; and
- Whereas early childhood programs can have a positive impact on children
- of immigrants and must be safe, consistent and nurturing places of learning
- 16 for children and families; and
- 17 Whereas United States Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) has
- 18 a policy that prohibits enforcement actions in sensitive locations, including
- 19 schools and early childhood education centers; and
- 20 Whereas ICE's sensitive location policy is merely an internal policy
- 21 without the force of law, and it is subject to change at any time; now,
- 22 therefore,

### 23 Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:

- 24 That we, the members of the Eighty-first Legislative Assembly, respect-
- 25 fully urge the Congress of the United States to pass, and the President to
- 26 sign, legislation implementing the internal Immigration and Customs
- 27 Enforcement policy that prohibits enforcement actions in sensitive locations;
- 28 and be it further
- Resolved, That a copy of this memorial shall be sent to the President of
- 30 the United States, to the Senate Majority Leader, to the Speaker of the
- 31 House of Representatives, to each member of the Oregon Congressional Del-

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egation and to the United States Secretary of Homeland Security.
