**SUBJECT:** 2021 Committee LC Summaries

**LC 1938, dated 12/3/2020** – Requires the Oregon Liquor Control Commission to study issues related to revenue derived from the sales of alcoholic beverages and report to the Legislative Assembly by September 1, 2022.

**LC 2141, dated 11/6/2020** – Creates the position of School Nurse Specialist within the Department of Education and specifies responsibilities.

**LC 2204, dated 11/4/2020** – Delays sunset of requirement that health benefit plans provide coverage of applied behavior analysis for autism spectrum disorder (SB 365 (2013)) from January 2, 2022 to January 2, 2030. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

**LC 2266, dated 10/23/2020** – Changes authorization to practice for behavior analysis interventionists from registration to licensure. Allows applied behavior analysis professional to provide outpatient treatment for mental or emotional disorder or chemical dependency without patient's parental consent. Requires applied behavior analysis professional to report child abuse and to report prohibited or unprofessional conduct of another applied behavior analysis professional. Prohibits applied behavior analysis professional from practicing conversion therapy. Delays sunset of requirement that health benefit plans provide coverage of applied behavior analysis for autism spectrum disorder (SB 365 (2013)) from January 2, 2022 to January 2, 2030. Takes effect on 91<sup>st</sup> day following adjournment sine die.
