
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Measure 110's Requirements for OHA

- Requires OHA to administer and support all aspects of implementing the Act.
- Temporary 24/7 crisis hotline by Feb. 1, 2021.
- Form Oversight and Accountability Council by Feb 1, 2021.
- 24/7 Addiction Recovery Centers (ARCs) throughout the state by Oct. 1, 2021.
- Grants program to pay for ARC treatment and recovery services.







Areas to address for successful implementation

- Funding. Shifts marijuana tax dollars that currently pay for non-Medicaid BH services. Without replacing these dollars, existing services will be negatively impacted.
- Service Array and Integration. The measure does not include the full array of addiction treatment services, nor does it address integration of these services into the current healthcare system.
- Workforce. ARCs are meant to offer services 24/7/365. Trained credentialed workers will be required for assessments. Our workforce lacks this capacity.



OHA Recommendations

- Ensure M110 intervention supports and services are integrated into the broader behavioral health and healthcare systems
- Ensure robust participation in program design and oversight by consumers, communities of color and tribal communities
- Work with the Governor's office and legislature to ensure shifts in marijuana funding within OHA do not result in disruptions to existing services
- Focus marijuana funds on purchasing services and supports where there are no alternative means of funding
