

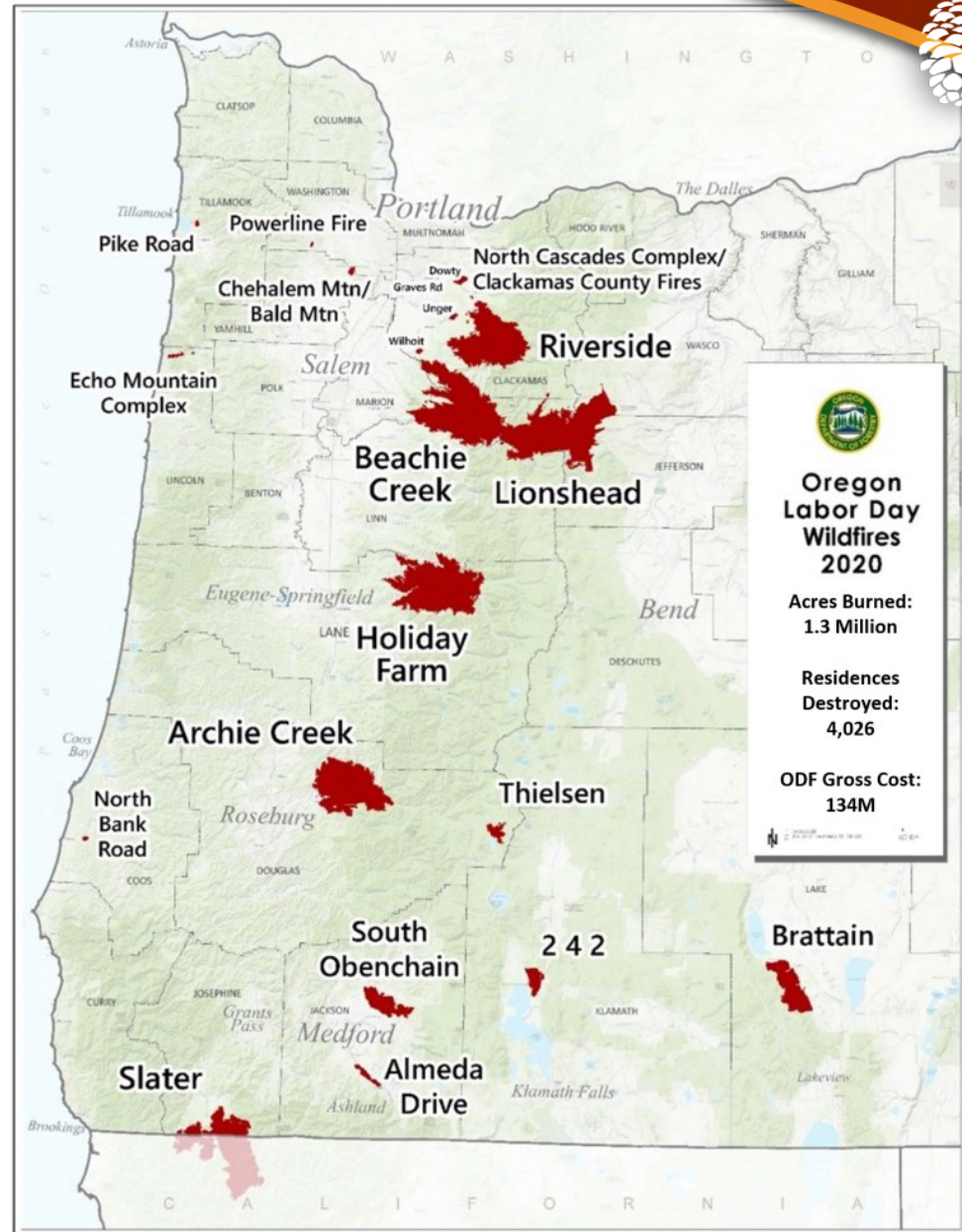

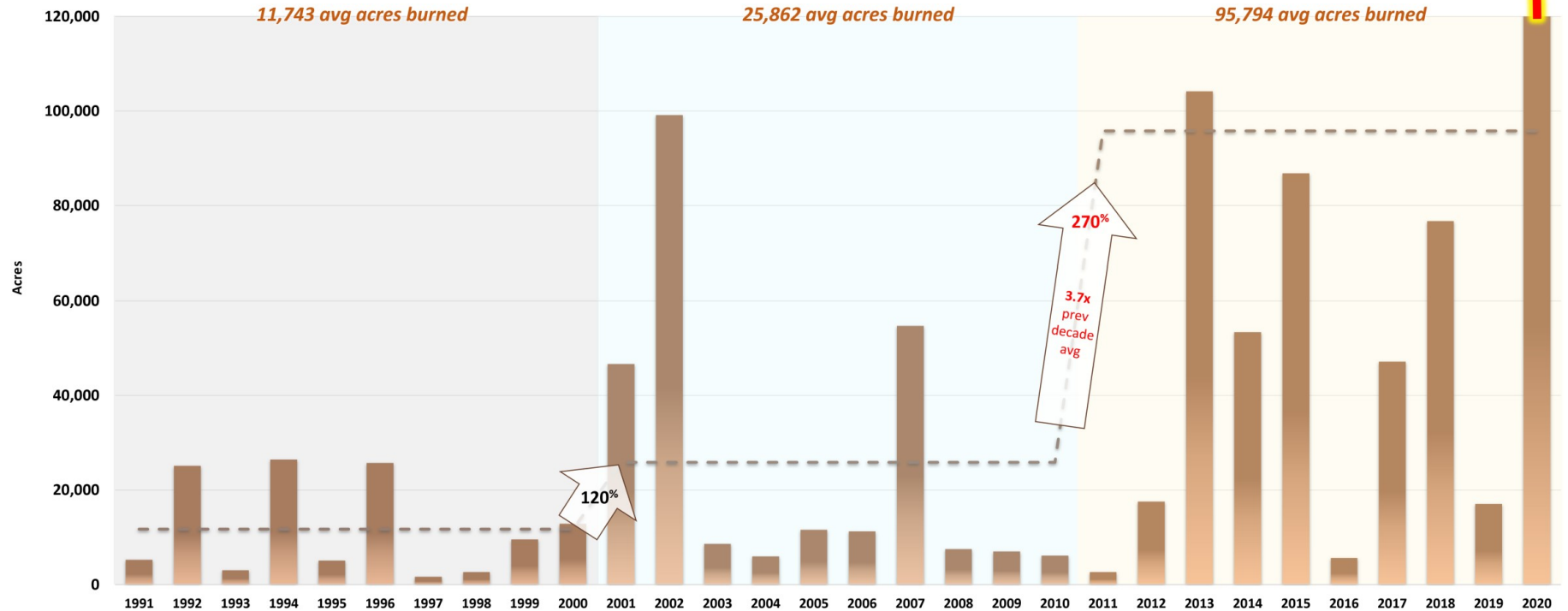
ODF Protected Lands

Gross Costs YTD

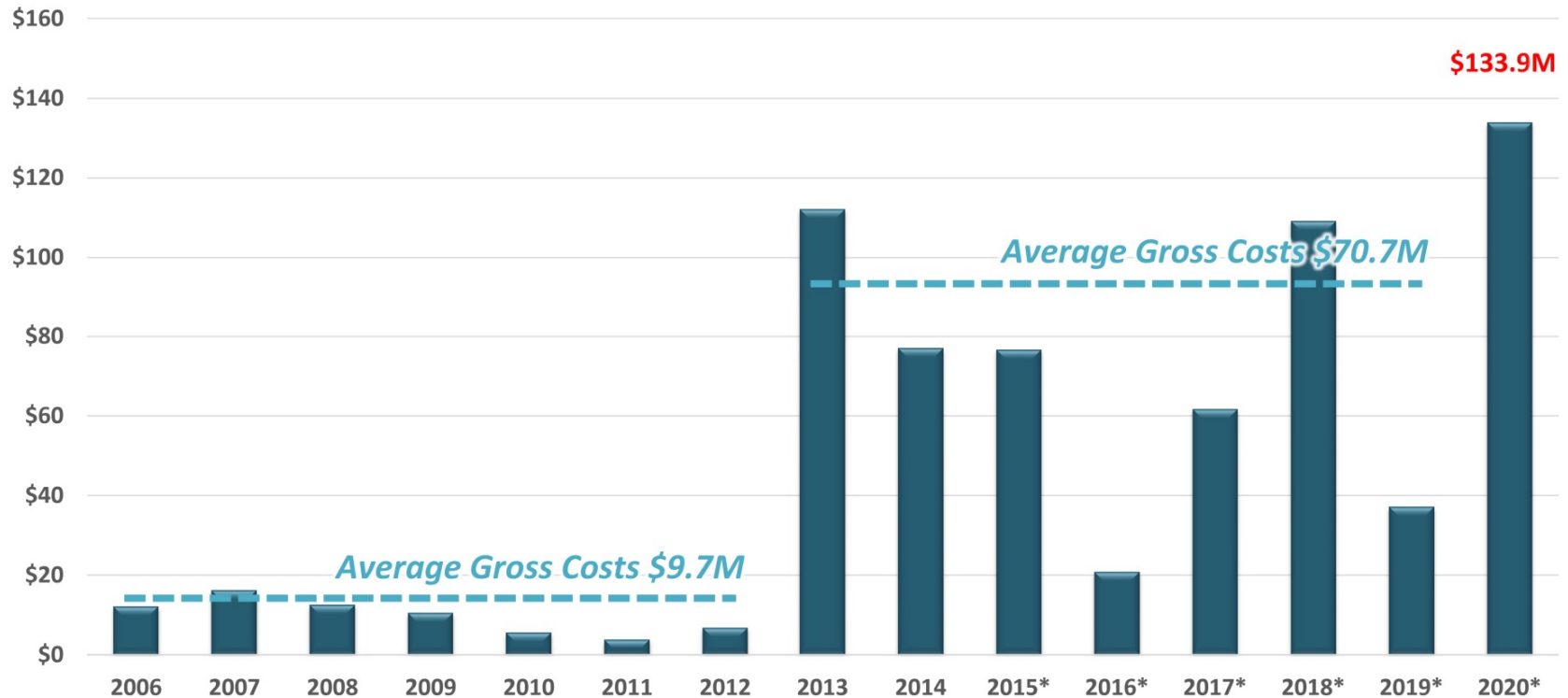


ODF Large Fire Costs

ODF Protection Finance and EFCC Data Dec 3, 2020.

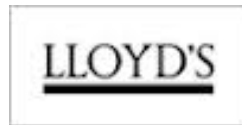

Oregon's Complete & Coordinated Fire Protection System

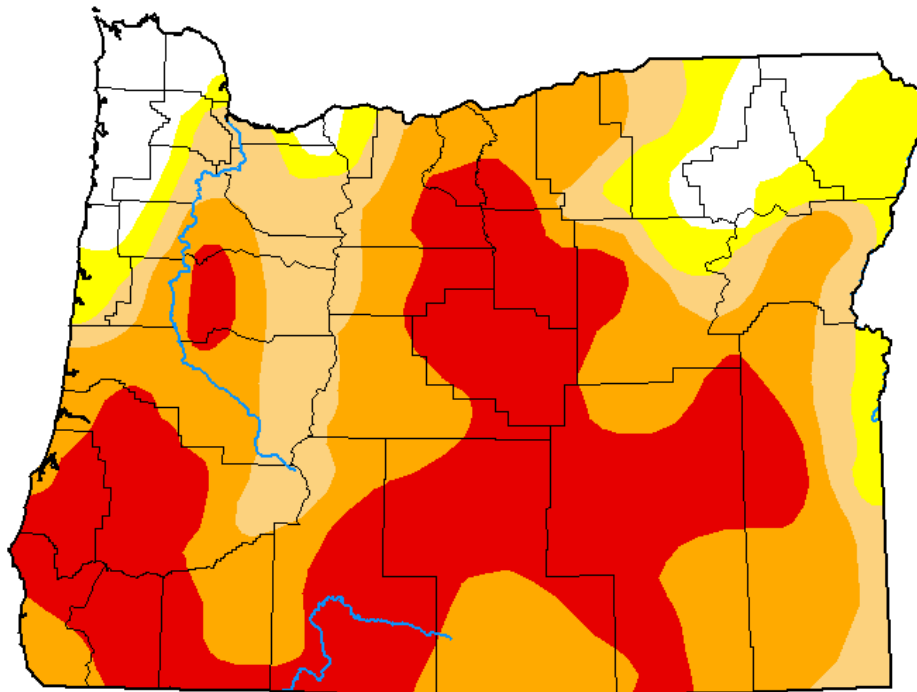
