



Draft concept includes:

Will expand Oregon's current Renewable Fuel Standard (RFS) from 5% (B5) to 20% (B20).

- April 1 October 1: B20 -- Every gallon of on-road diesel must contain 20% biomass-based diesel
- October 2 March 31: B5 -- Every gallon of on-road diesel must contain 5% biomass-based diesel
- Maintains current exemptions for railroad, marine and off road uses.





Emissions Benefits from Increasing OR's RFS

	Current Standard: 5% Biodiesel (B5)	Expanded Standard: 20% Biodiesel (B20)
Carbon Dioxide Emissions	-3.8%	-15%
Particulate Matter Emissions	-3.1%	-12%






Biodiesel (B20) Retail Pricing Relative to Diesel

New England	\$2.30	\$2.82	-\$0.52
Central Atlantic	\$2.31	\$2.62	-\$0.31
Lower Atlantic	\$1.83	\$2.44	-\$0.61
Midwest	\$2.36	\$2.52	-\$0.16
Gulf Coast	\$2.23	\$2.27	-\$0.04
Rocky Mountain	\$2.59	\$2.44	\$0.15
West Coast	\$2.82	\$3.33	-\$0.51
NATIONAL AVERAGE	\$2.36	\$2.61	-\$0.25





Biodiesel (B20) Historical Pricing Relative to Diesel







Benefits:

- Immediate reduction in harmful diesel tailpipe emissions
- Immediate reduction in carbon emissions
- No increase in cost to implement or administer the program
- Lower fuel prices for diesel consumers
- Integrates well with existing policies such Oregon's Clean Fuel Program.
