SUMMARY

Modifies criteria for erecting roadside memorial signs for deceased veterans formerly prisoners of war or unaccounted for.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to memorial highways; amending ORS 366.931; and prescribing an
- 3 effective date.

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- Whereas nearly 1,000 members of the armed forces who remain missing
- 5 in action have called Oregon their home, including an estimated 21 from
- 6 World War I, 887 from World War II, two from the Cold War, 57 from the
- 7 Korean War and 33 from the Vietnam War; and
- 8 Whereas those from this state who remain missing in action represent
- 9 approximately 16 percent of the nearly 6,000 Oregonians who paid the ulti-
- 10 mate sacrifice while serving in the military since the Civil War; and
- Whereas 770 Oregonians were prisoners of war during World War II, and,
- 12 of those Oregonians, approximately 78 percent were returned to the custody
- of the United States, 11 percent were executed by the enemy, 10 percent died
- 14 in the custody of the enemy and the fate of one percent to this day remains
- 15 unknown; and
- Whereas the Legislative Assembly, with the assistance of the Bend Heroes
- 17 Foundation and its partners, has established memorial highways across
- 18 Oregon to honor veterans, including the World War I Veterans Memorial
- 19 Highway, the World War II Veterans Historic Highway, the Korean War
- 20 Veterans Memorial Highway, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Highway, the

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- 1 Persian Gulf, Afghanistan and Iraq Veterans Memorial Highway, the Purple
- 2 Heart Trail and the Oregon Medal of Honor Highway; and
- Whereas the 74-mile segment of U.S. Highway 26 beginning at U.S.
- 4 Highway 101 and ending at Interstate 5 was designated as the Sunset High-
- 5 way in 1946 by the Oregon State Highway Commission to honor the 41st
- 6 Infantry Division, which was deployed in World War II following the
- 7 Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor and whose soldiers wore uniforms display-
- 8 ing a sunset insignia; and
- 9 Whereas at the request of the Bend Heroes Foundation, the Legislative
- 10 Assembly established the Oregon Medal of Honor Highway on the 451 miles
- of U.S. Highway 20 that cross this state, honoring current and future recip-
- 12 ients of the Medal of Honor; and
- 13 Whereas memorial highways honor the many Oregonians who served in
- 14 the military during five major wars since World War I, whose numbers ap-
- 15 proach 500,000; and
- Whereas the Bend Heroes Foundation and its partners raised over
- 17 \$100,000 to pay for the creation, installation and maintenance of 79 markers
- 18 alongside those veterans memorial highways; and
- 19 Whereas at the request of the Bend Heroes Foundation, the Legislative
- 20 Assembly established the POW/MIA Memorial Highway on the 471 miles of
- 21 U.S. Highway 26 that cross this state to honor Oregonians who have been
- 22 a prisoner of war or missing in action since the Civil War; and
- 23 Whereas nearly 1,770 Oregonians have been prisoners of war or missing
- 24 in action since the Civil War; and
- 25 Whereas Oregonians are deeply concerned about the fate of the
- 26 Oregonians who were prisoners of war or missing in action; and
- 27 Whereas the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency searches worldwide
- 28 for the remains of individuals who are unaccounted for to return the remains
- 29 of those missing in action to families for final closure; and
- 30 Whereas the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency continues to recover
- and return remains of individuals missing in action to Oregon families; and

- 1 Whereas roadside memorial signs will complement the POW/MIA Memo-
- 2 rial Highway to educate the public and honor the prisoners of war and those
- 3 missing in action; now, therefore,
- 4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 366.931 is amended to read:
- 6 366.931. (1) As used in this section, "Armed Forces of the United States"
- 7 has the meaning given that term in ORS 348.282.
- 8 (2) To recognize and honor those who were killed in action or who died
- 9 as a result of wounds received in action while serving in the Armed Forces
- 10 of the United States, the Department of Transportation shall erect and
- 11 maintain a Fallen Hero roadside memorial sign if:
- 12 (a)(A) The Legislative Assembly adopts a concurrent resolution that re-
- 13 cognizes the individual killed in the line of duty; or
- 14 (B) The individual killed in the line of duty was formerly designated
- 15 as either a prisoner of war or unaccounted for by the Defense
- 16 POW/MIA Accounting Agency and the remains of the individual have
- 17 been recovered, identified and returned to Oregon; and
- (b) The department receives the payment of a fee determined by the de-
- 19 partment under subsection (3) of this section.
- 20 (3) The department shall determine the amount of the fee required under
- 21 subsection (2)(b) of this section by rule. The fee may not exceed the direct
- 22 and indirect expenses associated with erecting, maintaining and removing a
- 23 roadside memorial sign.
- 24 (4) The department shall deposit the fees that the department collects
- 25 under this section into the Roadside Memorial Fund established under ORS
- 26 366.932.
- 27 (5) A public body, as defined in ORS 174.109, may not expend moneys for
- 28 the purpose of paying the fee required under this section.
- 29 (6) The department, by rule, shall establish the size, design and location
- 30 of a roadside memorial sign erected under this section. The sign must include
- 31 the name of the individual the sign is recognizing.

- 3 366.931. (1) As used in this section, "Armed Forces of the United States"
- 4 means:
- 5 (a) The Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps and Coast Guard of the
- 6 United States;
- 7 (b) The reserves of the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps and Coast
- 8 Guard of the United States; and
- 9 (c) The Oregon National Guard and a National Guard of any other state
- 10 or territory.

- of the United States, the Department of Transportation shall erect and
