High School Dropout Rate in Oregon

- Oregon has the 2nd second highest dropout rate in the country (76%)
 - Shared with Alaska and Arizona
- Second only to New Mexico
- How can we respond?
 - High school equivalency test
 - GED[®] test

18 million test passers since inception including hundreds of thousands of Oregonians

What the GED® Test Measures

Measures both High School Equivalency and College and Career Readiness (CCR)

Measures essential higher-order thinking and problem-solving skills needed for success in jobs and career and college training programs

Ensures that passers demonstrate the knowledge and skills on par with high school grads

Standardized and normed on a national sample of high school grads from the class of 2013



American Council on Education (ACE) Recommendations for the GED® Test

GED® College Ready


- Score of 165 174 on any content test
- Waived from developmental education in content requirements/courses
- Waived from placement testing, and
- Placed directly in credit-bearing courses

GED® College Ready + Credit

- Score of 175 200 on any content test
- Same as CR recommendations, plus
- Up to 10 semester hours of college credit



GED Grads: Postsecondary Persistence





Oregon 2014 - Current

During this time frame Oregon's GED® test pass rate is 93%. Only 2 states in the U.S. have a higher pass rate and Oregon exceeds each of these 2 states in the number of GED® test-takers and passers.

Oregon GED[®] test-takers are achieving the GED[®] College and Career Readiness level at a higher percentage than test-takers nationally.

- Prepare for subject area tests
 - Language Arts
 - Science
 - Social Studies
 - Math
- Take practice tests (optional)
- Take subject area tests



The Oregon GED® Testing Situation

- •Availability of in-person GED® testing reduced during the pandemic due to stay at home orders, colleges going fully remote, etc.
- Re-opening status of in-person testing centers varies greatly across Oregon.
- •Many individuals are wary of in-person testing due to many concerns.
- Students needed an alternative testing option.



Online Proctored (OP) GED® Test: The Basics

- Test-takers can take the GED test from the comfort of their home or other location that meets the criteria.
- What is it? The GED test is delivered online and is continually monitored by a trained proctor and artificial intelligence.
- To date almost 300 individuals have passed via the OP test delivery method.



Key Developments in Oregon's GED® Program

2015-20 Legislative Funding –Approx. \$6 million investment

- GED Annual Summit statewide professional development
- Grants to local programs for wraparound services to support GED® test students
- Two new staff to support local programs and students (1.8 FTE)

Increase partnership with GED Testing Service:

- Online proctored testing
- Accommodations requests more accessible
- Ongoing collaborative professional development for Oregon educators
- Improved student experience via www.ged.com
- GED graduate outcome data sharing agreement with HECC
