



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A K-shaped recession








Percent Change in Employment*

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Job loss much worse in services








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Percent Change in Employment*




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






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

Re-Opened States vs. Control States: Consumer Spending




Third wave may have peaked in Oregon





Oregon's Racial Poverty Gap Remains Large, But is Narrowing




Oregon Total nonfarm employment
