Directs state agencies to follow Childhood and Early Parenting Principles as framework for policies and programs for early parenting and early childhood development.

HB 2939** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Student Success Directs Youth Development Division to develop and administer statewide youth reengagement system. HB 3115 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Revenue

Removes sunset on provisions that allow foreign exchange students residing in dormitories to be considered resident students for purpose of State School Fund distributions.

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means Provides that current or former foster child under 25 years of age is eligible for tuition waiver at institution of higher education if current or former foster child is enrolled in courses totaling one or more credit hours for purposes of pursuing initial undergraduate degree.

Requires school district to report on number of incidents during which students of classroom were removed from classroom because other student in classroom was acting in manner that would threaten to injure other person or to damage school property.

HB 2213 **

Requires each community college and public university to ensure that course description for every academic course offered in succeeding academic term lists all textbooks enrolled students are required to purchase. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means HB 2214 ** Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Higher Education Coordinating Commission for purpose of funding Oregon's Open Educational Resources (OER) Program. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Student Success Creates Oregon Bright Futures Plan Task Force. HB 2519 Requires community colleges and universities operating in this state that receive state financial aid to adopt written policy on hazing, provide on-campus policy training on hazing and annually report to Higher Education Coordinating Commission number of hazing incidents reported and investigated by community college or university during previous academic year. HB 2594 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Higher Education Coordinating Commission for Sustainable City Year Program at University of Oregon. HB 2910 Requires that for person who completes prior educational requirements to participate in Oregon Promise program while incarcerated or detained, six-month period to enroll in courses to participate in program begins after person's period of incarceration or detention has ended.

HB 2989

Allows student enrolled in program provided by school district or education service district to earn General Educational Development (GED) certificate to participate in interscholastic activities.
