- HB 2736 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Student Success  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04/03/2019 AGENDA: Allows school district and public charter school to implement nationally recognized high school assessment in mathematics, science or English if assessment complies with specified criteria.
- HB 3038 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04/03/2019 AGENDA: Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to establish Oregon work study pilot program to assist post-secondary students.

- HB 2516 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Revenue  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04/03/2019 AGENDA: Prohibits virtual public school from using moneys received as distributions from State School Fund or from other state or local public sources for paying expenses incurred for advertising or other promotional materials of school.
- HB 2902 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Student Success  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04/03/2019 AGENDA: Requires school district to report on number of incidents during which students of classroom were removed from classroom because other student in classroom was acting in manner that would threaten to injure other person or to damage school property.
- HB 2910  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04/03/2019 AGENDA: Requires that for person who completes prior educational requirements to participate in Oregon Promise program while incarcerated or detained, six-month period to enroll in courses to participate in program begins after person's period of incarceration or detention has ended.
- HB 3032 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Student Success  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04/03/2019 AGENDA: Prescribes notification requirements for school district upon receipt of report of act of harassment, intimidation, bullying or cyberbullying and upon completion of investigation into report.

- HB 3236 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Student Success  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04/03/2019 AGENDA: Directs Department of Education to implement assessment system that limits number of content-based assessments and criterion-referenced assessments and to encourage school districts to use performance-based assessments.
- HB 3241 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Student Success  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04/03/2019 AGENDA: Directs Department of Education to develop and administer grant program to distribute moneys to school districts and education service districts to create safe points of entry to school buildings.

- HB 2876  
Directs Department of Education to conduct study to determine adequacy of public education in state.
- HB 2965  
Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to conduct study to determine best method for reducing amount of student debt owed by individuals who graduate from community colleges and public universities.
- HB 2967  
Directs Department of Education to conduct study to identify sources of stable and sustainable funding for career and technical education programs.

- HB 2074 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Student Success  
Directs Oregon Department of Administrative Services to prepare tentative budget for funding of State School Fund.
- HB 2441 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Student Success  
Requires school districts to provide coordinated comprehensive school counseling program.
- HB 2520  
Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to conduct study to determine whether state should recognize more than one high school equivalency test.
- HB 2759 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Student Success  
Establishes School Breakfast and Lunch Reimbursement Account for purpose of reimbursing school districts for certain costs incurred in providing breakfast and lunch.
- HB 2760 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Student Success  
Establishes Universal School Meal Account for purpose of reimbursing school districts for certain costs incurred in providing federally reimbursable meals.
- HB 2761 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Student Success  
Allows school district to seek reimbursement for amounts incurred from providing school meals as required by state law.
- HB 2765  
Requires school district that provides breakfast to make breakfast available after start of school day.

*Please note: HB 2899 is scheduled for a work session solely for the purpose of moving it without recommendation, rescinding the referral to the Joint Committee on Student Success and requesting referral to the committee on Rules.*

- HB 2899 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Student Success  
Prescribes requirements for removal of student from classroom or school setting by school employees or law enforcement.
- HB 2976  
Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission to adopt by rule additional minimum standards for licensing of career schools that receive \$10 million or more in annual revenue or that are subsidiary with parent company.
- HB 2990 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Student Success  
Establishes Task Force on Family Engagement in Education.
