SB 496 A

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 5/15/2019 AGENDA: Prohibits school district from restricting access by alternative education students, English language learners or special education students to specialized learning areas and certain common areas.

SB 690 A

Repeals sunset provision for Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children.

SB 802

Allows military child to be considered resident of school district for purposes of enrollment and class placement based on official military order for transfer of parent of child.
