Work Session

- HB 2856 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Water Resources Department to study ground water in this state.
- HB 2618 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Requires State Department of Energy to adopt by rule program for providing rebates for purchase, construction or installation of residential and commercial solar electric systems and paired solar and storage systems.
- HB 2509
Prohibits use of single-use checkout bags except in certain cases.
- HB 2329
Modifies definition of "energy facility" for purposes of regulation of energy facilities by Energy Facility Siting Council.

Public Hearing

- HB 3065
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 03-26-2019 AGENDA: Directs Public Utility Commission to establish public process for investigating continuing relevance of telecommunications carrier of last resort obligations.
- HB 2857
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 03-26-2019 AGENDA: Requires eight percent of electricity sold in this state by each electric company that makes sales to 25,000 or more retail electricity consumers to be generated by small-scale renewable energy facilities or certain biomass facilities.
- HB 3274
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 03-26-2019 AGENDA: Requires eight percent of electricity sold in this state by each electric company that makes sales to 25,000 or more retail electricity consumers to be generated by small-scale renewable energy facilities or certain biomass facilities.
- HB 2496
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 03-26-2019 AGENDA: Includes battery storage in definition of "green energy technology." Defines "total contract price." Permits contracting agency, as alternative to including green energy technology in construction, reconstruction or major renovation of public building, to make expenditure to improve energy use efficiency in public building.

- HB 2855
Modifies general powers of Public Utility Commission.
- HB 3055
Prohibits sale of mattress or children's product that incorporates or bears specified chemicals unless person affixes or attaches warning to mattress or children's product.
- HB 3141
Modifies and adds laws related to electric vehicle charging stations.
