HB 3156

Authorizes Environmental Quality Commission to adopt by rule schedule of enhanced civil penalties for violations involving cargo tank motor vehicles of certain environmental laws.

HB 3157

Requires Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services to amend Low-Rise Residential Dwelling Code to require alternative energy collection or generation by December 15, 2020.

HB 3174

Directs Public Utility Commission to require electricity or natural gas utility to provide analog meter option for residential customers.

HB 2322

Requires Land Conservation and Development Commission to amend statewide land use planning goals related to energy to incorporate development of renewable energy facilities and reduction of greenhouse gas emissions and to match state energy policies.

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Prohibits food vendor from using polystyrene container in selling, offering for sale, serving or dispensing prepared food to public.

HB 2819 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires Water Resources Department to establish pilot program to make conserved Columbia River water available to holder of water right in critical ground water area in exchange for holder reducing appropriation of ground water.

HB 2853

Requires Water Resources Department to maintain registry of historic-use reservoirs.

HB 2860 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires Oregon Health Authority to analyze ground water contaminant data and provide education in areas with ground water contaminant problems.
