- HB 2494
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04-04-2019 5:30PM AGENDA: Extends operation of public purpose charges until January 1, 2036.
- HB 2496
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04-04-2019 5:30PM AGENDA: Includes battery storage in definition of "green energy technology." Defines "total contract price." Permits contracting agency, as alternative to including green energy technology in construction, reconstruction or major renovation of public building, to make expenditure to improve energy use efficiency in public building.
- HB 2860 **
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04-04-2019 5:30PM AGENDA: Requires Oregon Health Authority to analyze ground water contaminant data and provide education in areas with ground water contaminant problems. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- HB 2883 **
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04-04-2019 5:30PM AGENDA: Prohibits food vendor from using polystyrene container in selling, offering for sale, serving or dispensing prepared food to public. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- HB 3055
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04-04-2019 5:30PM AGENDA: Prohibits sale of mattress or children's product that incorporates or bears specified chemicals unless person affixes or attaches warning to mattress or children's product.
- HB 3141
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04-04-2019 5:30PM AGENDA: Modifies and adds laws related to electric vehicle charging stations.
- HB 3326 **
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04-04-2019 5:30PM AGENDA: Declares harmful algal blooms to be menace to public health and welfare. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
- HB 3274
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04-04-2019 1:00PM AGENDA: Requires eight percent of electricity sold in this state by each electric company that makes sales to 25,000 or more retail electricity consumers to be generated by small-scale renewable energy facilities or certain biomass facilities.

April 9, 2019

- HB 3407
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 04-04-2019 1:00PM AGENDA: Authorizes electric companies that are subject to renewable portfolio standards to offer to purchase qualifying electricity generated by certain hydroelectric facilities.
- HB 2329
Modifies definition of "energy facility" for purposes of regulation of energy facilities by Energy Facility Siting Council.

The following bill is scheduled for the purpose of recommending referral to the House Committee on Rules.

Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

- HB 2619
Prohibits sale, offering for sale, purchase or use of pesticide products containing neonicotinoid.

Note change: HB 2494, HB 2496, HB 2860, HB 2883, HB 3055, HB 3141 and HB 3326 have been added.
