HB 2600 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires long term care facilities and residential care facilities providing care to six or more residents to adopt specified protocols and procedures regarding preventing and reporting disease outbreaks.

HB 2610 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires Oregon Health Authority to establish program for periodic health inspection of hotel or inn guest facilities.

HB 2292

Requires Oregon Health Authority, in consultation with Department of Environmental Quality, to study manners in which state has authority to regulate use of asbestos in new products manufactured, sold or offered for sale in Oregon, and submit report on findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to environment and natural resources on or before September 15, 2021.

HB 2693

Requires health benefit plan to reimburse cost of covered telemedicine health service provided by health professional licensed or certified in this state if same health service is provided in person.

HB 2190

Allows licensed optometrist to engage in practice of telemedicine.
