Public Hearing and Work Session

HB 2011

Requires specified professional regulatory boards to require persons authorized to practice professions regulated by board to complete cultural competency continuing education.

HB 3231

Authorizes Health Licensing Office to issue license to practice genetic counseling to qualified applicant. HB 3311

Removes requirement that physician assistant practice under supervision of supervising physician.

HB 3397 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means Requires Oregon Health Authority to contract with person to be purchasing agent to assist authority in purchasing prescription drugs for medical assistance recipients.

Work Session

HB 2267

Requires Oregon Health Authority to report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to health, no later than September 20, 2020, on implementation of provisions requiring coordinated care organization governing boards to be more transparent.

HB 2269

Requires Oregon Health Authority, in consultation with stakeholders, to propose to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to health, by January 1, 2020, long term solutions to financing health care in Oregon.

- **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means HB 2600 ** Requires long term care facilities and residential care facilities providing care to six or more residents to adopt specified protocols and procedures regarding preventing and reporting disease outbreaks.
- HB 2303

Deletes requirement that pseudoephedrine be classified as Schedule III controlled substance.

HB 2678

Subject to exceptions, allows Oregon Health Authority to require prior authorization for prescription drugs, other than mental health drugs, that are not listed on Practitioner-Managed Prescription Drug Plan and that are reimbursed on feefor-service basis.

- HB 2658 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means Requires manufacturer of prescription drugs to report to Department of Consumer and Business Services planned increase in price of certain prescription drugs at least 60 days before date of increase.
- **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means HB 3273 ** Directs each manufacturer of prescription drugs that are sold within this state to develop and implement drug take-back program for purpose of collecting from individuals and nonbusiness entities prescription drugs for disposal.
- HB 3074

Limits rate review process that invites public comment to process for approving rates for health benefit plans. HB 3076

Requires nonprofit hospitals and hospital systems to establish financial assistance policies meeting specified criteria.

HB 3075 **

Permits duplicate health benefit plan coverage for public employees.

HB 2035

Reestablishes Mental Health Clinical Advisory Group in Oregon Health Authority to continue development of evidence-based algorithms for prescription drug treatment of mental health disorders.

HB 2266

Requires Oregon Health Policy Board to study changes in health care coverage in Oregon since implementation of Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and report results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to health.

HB 2667 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

- Establishes Adult Suicide Intervention and Prevention Coordinator within Oregon Health Authority. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means HB 3250 **
- Establishes Reporting Relief and Medicaid Transparency Task Force.
- HB 3267

Requires Oregon Health Authority to research innovative approaches to delivery and financing of health care in other states and countries and report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to health on any practices that could be implemented in this state.

HB 3278 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Revenue

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Allows additional weight for purpose of State School Fund distributions for students in drug or alcohol treatment programs that meet certain requirements. **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

HB 3307 **

Assesses fee on emergency medical services providers and uses fee to increase reimbursement paid by Oregon Health Authority for emergency medical services transports.

HB 3331 **

Allows eligible employee who declines coverage in health benefit plan offered by Oregon Educators Benefit Board or Public Employees' Benefit Board and who is enrolled as spouse or family member in another health benefit plan offered by Oregon Educators Benefit Board or Public Employees' Benefit Board to be paid employer contribution for plan that was declined.
