Public Hearing and Work Session

- SB 707 A
Establishes Youth Suicide Intervention and Prevention Advisory Committee.
- SB 918
Directs local mental health authority to notify local systems having contact with deceased individual 24 years of age or younger of suspected suicide if local mental health authority received notice of death from third party.

Work Session

- SB 765 A** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Modifies definitions of "primary care" and "total medical expenditures" for purpose of reports on spending for primary care by insurance carriers, Public Employees' Benefit Board, Oregon Educators Benefit Board and coordinated care organizations.
- SB 249 A
CARRIED OVER FROM 05/09/2019 AGENDA: Specifies requirements for insurer determinations regarding requests for prior authorization for coverage of health care items, services, procedures and settings.
- SB 742 A
Allows Health Licensing Office to issue license to engage in practice of athletic training to qualified applicant.

Public Hearing and Work Session

- SB 250 A
CARRIED OVER FROM 05/09/2019 AGENDA: Prohibits individual from being excluded from participation in or denied benefits under health benefit plan issued or delivered in this state based on actual or perceived race, color, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, age or disability.
- SB 134 A
Requires coordinated care organizations to publish on website document to educate members regarding treatment options and support resources available for members who have mental illnesses or substance use disorders.

- SB 142 A
Changes "venereal disease" and "sexually transmitted disease" to "sexually transmitted infection." Changes certain references to "human immunodeficiency virus" and "acquired immune deficiency syndrome" to "blood-borne infection."
- SB 1027
Allows certain health care practitioner who receives needlestick injury during provision of medical care to patient who is unconscious or otherwise unable to consent to test patient for human immunodeficiency virus for purpose of determining necessary course of treatment for health care practitioner.
- SB 910 A
Requires retail or hospital pharmacy to provide written notice in conspicuous manner of availability of naloxone at pharmacy.
