#### Work Session

- SB 918  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 05/14/2019 AGENDA: Directs local mental health authority to notify local systems having contact with deceased individual 24 years of age or younger of suspected suicide if local mental health authority received notice of death from third party.
- SB 698 A  
Directs State Board of Pharmacy to adopt rules to require prescription drugs for specified persons be labeled or dispensed with informational insert in English and other language.

#### Public Hearing and Work Session

- SB 910 A  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 05/14/2019 AGENDA: Requires retail or hospital pharmacy to provide written notice in conspicuous manner of availability of naloxone at pharmacy.
- SB 1027  
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 05/14/2019 AGENDA: Allows certain health care practitioner who receives needlestick injury during provision of medical care to patient who is unconscious or otherwise unable to consent to test patient for human immunodeficiency virus for purpose of determining necessary course of treatment for health care practitioner.
- SB 1041 A  
Grants to Oregon Health Authority powers to regulate financial condition of coordinated care organizations that align with powers of Department of Consumer and Business Services to regulate domestic insurers.
- SB 253 A  
Authorizes Public Health Officer to appoint local health officer in certain counties.
- SB 823 A  
Requires health care employer to conduct comprehensive security and safety evaluation using state or nationally recognized workplace violence prevention toolkit.
- SB 26  
Directs Director of the Oregon Health Authority or director's designee to discharge employee at facility under jurisdiction of authority if it has been substantiated that employee physically or sexually abused patient or client.

SB 1039 A

Authorizes appointment of health care advocate to make health care decisions for individual with developmental disability receiving services through individualized written service plan if individual does not have guardian or health care representative.
