HB 3394
Modifies required child care resource and referral entity services.

Work Session

HB 2332 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs Governor to provide staff support for Governor's Child Foster Care Advisory Commission.

Please note: this bill is being scheduled for the purpose of reconsideration of the amendment adopted on March 25th

HB 2626 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Expands eligibility for Women, Infants and Children Program nutrition assistance to children up to 24 months of age, paid for with state funds.

HB 2639 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Expands eligibility for Women, Infants and Children Program nutrition assistance to children five years of age or older who have not entered kindergarten, paid for with state funds.

HB 2346 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes Task Force on Employment-Related Child Care to conduct study on improving access to and availability of subsidies for employment-related child care, to make recommendations for improving communications between Early Learning Division and child care providers, to make recommendations for improving policy coordination between Early Learning Division and Department of Human Services self-sufficiency programs and to develop plan to expand access to employment-related child care opportunities.

- HB 2644 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs Youth Development Division to administer pilot program to coordinate delivery of youth development services through Youth Development Hubs.
- HB 2908
Requires division of Department of Human Services that administers Oregon Project Independence, in collaboration with area agencies, to study statewide expansion of Oregon Project Independence and resource needs of division if Oregon Project Independence is expanded statewide.
- HB 2568
Directs Oregon Department of Administrative Services to conduct study of CASA Volunteer Programs and report results of study and make recommendations for legislation to Legislative Assembly.
- HB 2969 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Creates trauma practice integration program in Governor's office to provide assistance to state agencies and private entities in providing trauma-informed services to children and adolescents.
- HB 2464
Modifies terminology regarding recipients of grants from Child Abuse Multidisciplinary Intervention Program.
- HB 2027
Permits Office of Child Care to consider any information obtained by office when reviewing enrollment in Central Background Registry.
- HB 3028 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Revenue
Increases percentage of federal earned income credit allowable as credit against Oregon personal income tax.
- HB 2771
Directs State Court Administrator to implement education program for state judges that focuses on issues that arise in international custody disputes.
- HB 3170 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Health Authority for Senior Farm Direct Nutrition Program and Women, Infants and Children Farm Direct Nutrition Program.

HB 2346, HB 2644, HB 2908, HB 2568, HB 2969, HB 2464, HB 2027, HB 3041, HB 3028, HB 2771, HB 2626, HB 2639, and HB 3170 have been changed from public hearings and possible work sessions to possible work sessions.
