- HB 3189  
Requires Department of Human Services to assess and quantify workload impacts of specified policy changes.
- HB 3394  
Modifies required child care resource and referral entity services.
- HB 2644 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Directs Youth Development Division to administer pilot program to coordinate delivery of youth development services through Youth Development Hubs.
- HB 2908  
Requires division of Department of Human Services that administers Oregon Project Independence, in collaboration with area agencies, to study statewide expansion of Oregon Project Independence and resource needs of division if Oregon Project Independence is expanded statewide.
- HB 2568  
Directs Oregon Department of Administrative Services to conduct study of CASA Volunteer Programs and report results of study and make recommendations for legislation to Legislative Assembly.
- HB 2969 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Creates trauma practice integration program in Governor's office to provide assistance to state agencies and private entities in providing trauma-informed services to children and adolescents.
- HB 2464  
Modifies terminology regarding recipients of grants from Child Abuse Multidisciplinary Intervention Program.

Permits Office of Child Care to consider any information obtained by office when reviewing enrollment in Central Background Registry.
- HB 2332 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Directs Governor to provide staff support for Governor's Child Foster Care Advisory Commission.
- HB 3041 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Directs Department of Human Services to establish and administer program to provide moneys for third-party child care for child in foster home.
- HB 3028 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Revenue  
Increases percentage of federal earned income credit allowable as credit against Oregon personal income tax.
- HB 2771  
Directs State Court Administrator to implement education program for state judges that focuses on issues that arise in international custody disputes.
- HB 2626 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Expands eligibility for Women, Infants and Children Program nutrition assistance to children up to 24 months of age, paid for with state funds.
- HB 2639 \*\* \*\*Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means  
Expands eligibility for Women, Infants and Children Program nutrition assistance to children five years of age or older who have not entered kindergarten, paid for with state funds.
