HB 3342

Requires certain medical and residential facilities to make available to patients and residents plant-based meals.

HB 3183

Adjusts punctuation in statute.

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means HB 2626 ** CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/1/2019 1:00 P.M. AGENDA: Expands eligibility for Women, Infants and Children Program nutrition assistance to children up to 24 months of age, paid for with state funds.

HB 2969 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/1/2019 1:00 P.M. AGENDA: Creates trauma practice integration program in Governor's office to provide assistance to state agencies and private entities in providing trauma-informed services to children and adolescents.

HB 2001 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Requires cities with population greater than 10,000 and counties with population greater than 15,000 to allow middle housing in lands zoned for single-family dwellings within urban growth boundary.

HB 2002 **

Requires property owner subject to affordability restriction to provide more notice to qualified purchasers before restrictions expire.

HB 2032 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

Specifies benefits that may be provided by Department of Human Services to low-income families after families, because of earnings or increases in hours of work, lose eligibility for temporary assistance for needy families (TANF).

HB 2033

Removes minimum degree requirements for individuals who conduct child abuse investigations or make determinations regarding protective custody of children.

HB 2570 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means Appropriates moneys to Oregon Department of Administrative Services to increase size and diversity of group of court appointed special advocates.

HB 3116 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Revenue

Requires counties with population of 650,000 or more to use proceeds from sale of foreclosed property to reimburse municipal liens against property for utilities improvements or seismic rehabilitation.

HB 3208

Directs Department of Human Services to study and develop two-year and five-year plans for department to provide comprehensive funding for child welfare services, ensure adequate in-state services for children's therapeutic care and request sufficient funding for high level staff.

HB 3270

Increases number of adults permitted to reside in adult foster home from five to seven.
