HB 2997
Defines "housing development." Authorizes cities and counties to impose affordable housing conditions on housing developments.

HB 3254 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes Office of Oregon Ombudsmen to provide administrative services and support to Office of the Long Term Care Ombudsman, Office of the Residential Facilities Ombudsman, Office of the Foster Parent Ombudsman, Office of the Foster Child Ombudsman and Office of the Oregon Public Guardian and Conservator.

Possible Work Session

HB 3184 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Revenue
Directs Department of Revenue, in consultation with Housing and Community Services Department, to conduct study of imposition and administration of residential vacancy tax to fund affordable housing, and to report findings to interim legislative committees related to revenue and housing on or before September 15, 2020.

Please note: HB 3184 is being scheduled for a possible work session solely to move it without recommendation to the House Committee on Revenue.

HB 3394
Modifies required child care resource and referral entity services.

HB 2360 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes Task Force on Use of Surplus Public Lands for Housing.

- HB 2337 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes Foster Parent Ombudsman in Department of Human Services and prescribes duties.
- HB 2947
Requires Department of Human Services to present options for living independently to adults with developmental disabilities who need placement.
- HB 3041 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs Department of Human Services to establish and administer program to provide moneys for third-party child care for child in foster home.
- HB 3178 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Modifies allocation formula for grants to regional assessment centers and community assessment centers.
- HB 3179 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs Department of Human Services to distribute \$1 million to Center for the Prevention of Abuse and Neglect to conduct Oregon Child Abuse Prevalence Study.
- HB 3191 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs Department of Human Services to accomplish various objectives to improve positions and skills of child welfare services employees.
- HB 3342
Requires certain medical and residential facilities to make available to patients and residents plant-based meals.
- HB 3359 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes Vacation Occupancy Task Force.
- HB 3383 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Directs Department of Human Services to develop pilot program contracting with Yamhill County for provision of community-based child welfare services.
- HB 3413 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Changes name of office of Long Term Care Ombudsman to office of Long Term Care Ombudsmen.
- HB 2027
Permits Office of Child Care to consider any information obtained by office when reviewing enrollment in Central Background Registry.
- HB 2771
Directs State Court Administrator to implement education program for state judges that focuses on issues that arise in international custody disputes.
- HB 2969 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Creates trauma practice integration program in Governor's office to provide assistance to state agencies and private entities in providing trauma-informed services to children and adolescents.
