## **Public Hearing**

HB 2401

Modifies definition of "officer-initiated pedestrian stop" for purposes of profiling data collection by removing requirement that stop result in citation, arrest or search.

HB 2797

Requires sentence of 58 to 130 months' imprisonment if person convicted of unlawful delivery or manufacture of controlled substance that results in death of another person from use of controlled substance.

HB 2299

Requires court to impose mandatory minimum sentence of imprisonment if person is convicted of crime of fleeing or attempting to elude police officer under certain circumstances.

#### **Work Session**

HB 2227

Modifies list of mandatory reporters of suspected child abuse to include animal control officers.

HB 2500

Provides private right of action to recover for expenses in relation to veterinary care for abused domestic animal.

HB 2625

Directs Department of State Police to study how to increase criminal justice resources relating to missing Native American women in Oregon and report to appropriate committee or interim committee of Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2020.
