HB 2866

CARRIED OVER FROM 03/12/2019 AGENDA: Prohibits person from collecting, using, storing, analyzing, deriving inferences from, selling, leasing or otherwise transferring geolocation information or audiovisual data about resident individual without first obtaining express consent from resident individual and making certain disclosures to resident individual.

HB 2614

CARRIED OVER FROM 03/12/2019 AGENDA: Repeals driving privilege suspension and eliminates imposition of driving privilege restrictions for failure to pay fine.

HB 2750 **

**Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means

CARRIED OVER FROM 03/12/2019 AGENDA: Directs Department of Justice to establish program for awarding grants to law enforcement agencies and local governments for training of groups and agencies that interact with persons who have experienced trauma.

Public Hearing

HB 2353

Authorizes Attorney General, district attorney or court to award penalty to public records requester, plus reasonable attorney fees, if public body responds to request with undue delay or fails to be responsive to request.

HB 2430

Eliminates sunset date of Public Records Advisory Council.

HB 2431

Requires each state agency to report to Attorney General, Public Records Advocate and public records subcommittee of Legislative Counsel Committee on number of public records requests received during preceding year, and number of those requests still outstanding after specified periods of time.

HB 3006

Modifies procedures for probate of estate with no known assets.

HB 3007

Modifies provisions relating to small estates.

HB 3008

Requires approval by probate court of settlement of personal injury claim or wrongful death claim arising out of injuries to decedent.

HB 2230

Limits amount of overtime nursing staff who work in correctional facility may be required to work.

HB 2321

Exempts from required disclosure pursuant to public records request, home address, home phone number and other specified personal information of county juvenile department employees who primarily perform duties related to youth offenders confined in detention facilities.

SB 186 A

Changes index for determining cost of living adjustments to limitations on damages under Oregon Tort Claims Act.

SB 355 A

Makes nonsubstantive and technical changes in Oregon law.
