Public Hearing

- HB 2244 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Establishes CourtCare Fund and appropriates moneys in fund to Department of Education for distribution to counties to operate CourtCare programs.
- HB 2842
Directs Center for Health Statistics to enter name of parent on original record of live birth when paternity or parentage has been determined under certain circumstances.
- HB 3335
Removes entering or remaining unlawfully in or on public transit vehicle or public transit station as manner of committing crime of interfering with public transportation.
- HB 3336
Provides that use of certain name other than name displayed on government-issued identification document does not constitute crime of giving false information to a peace officer in connection with a citation or warrant.
- HB 3337
Prohibits police officer from conducting or participating in activities intended to determine whether person has paid certain user charges, fees or tolls imposed by mass transit district.

Work Session

- HB 2051
Prohibits disclosure, pursuant to public records request, of contents of reports made through Department of State Police statewide tip line.
- HB 2241 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Ways and Means
Authorizes Chief Justice of the Supreme Court to impose fees on public bodies for use of certain electronic court services.
- HB 2353
Authorizes Attorney General, district attorney or court to award penalty to public records requester, plus reasonable attorney fees, if public body responds to request with undue delay or fails to be responsive to request.
- HB 2430
Eliminates sunset date of Public Records Advisory Council.

HB 2431

Requires each state agency to report to Attorney General, Public Records Advocate and public records subcommittee of Legislative Counsel Committee on number of public records requests received during preceding year, and number of those requests still outstanding after specified periods of time.
