Public Hearing and Work Session

- HB 3419
Prohibits prosecuting attorney from conditioning plea offer on waiver of specified rights, eligibilities and legal challenges.
- HB 3224
Directs district attorney of each county to, no later than December 1, 2020, develop and adopt policies relating to discovery, charging decisions and case disposition and to make policies available to public on website.
- HB 3289
Directs Department of Corrections to conduct study on correctional facility siting process and present report on findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary on or before September 15, 2020.
- HB 3399
Requires state agency, in proceeding agency initiates to enjoin disclosure of public records, to name Attorney General as respondent.

Work Session

- HB 2285
CARRIED OVER FROM 4/1/19 AGENDA: Clarifies receivership proceedings and reporting and notice requirements for residential properties that city or county determines are threat to public health, safety or welfare.
- HB 2353
Authorizes Attorney General, district attorney or court to award penalty to public records requester, plus reasonable attorney fees, if public body responds to request with undue delay or fails to be responsive to request.
- HB 2615
Repeals statutory authority for nonunanimous jury verdicts in criminal trials.
HB 2615 is heard for the sole purpose of referral to the House Committee on Rules without recommendation.
- HB 3146
CARRIED OVER FROM 4/1/19 AGENDA: Changes statutory references to "inmate" to "adult in custody."

- HB 3335
Removes entering or remaining unlawfully in or on public transit vehicle or public transit station as manner of committing crime of interfering with public transportation.
- HB 3336
Provides that use of certain name other than name displayed on government-issued identification document does not constitute crime of giving false information to a peace officer in connection with a citation or warrant.
- HJR 10 ** **Subsequent Referral(s) to Rules
Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to allow juries to impose verdicts in criminal cases only by unanimous agreement.
HJR 10 is heard for the sole purpose of referral to the House Committee on Rules without recommendation.

Note change: HB 2258 and HB 3146 carried over. HB 2615 and HJR 10 scheduled for Work Session for referral to House Rules Committee without recommendation.
