Public Hearing

SB 11 A

Requires person who purchases residential real property after forclosure complaint has been filed and before end of redemption period to provide notice to seller regarding relinquishment of interests in property and rights to surplus funds.

SB 369 A

Modifies definition of "substantial completion" for purposes of statute of limitation for action arising out of construction, alteration or repair of improvement to real property.

SB 873 A

Allows defendant in eviction action to apply for order setting aside judgment.

SB 24 A

Modifies procedures related to criminal defendants lacking fitness to proceed.

SB 25 A

Directs public bodies, and private medical providers in possession of relevant records, to comply, within specified time period, with court order for release of records to state mental hospital or other facility for purposes of forensic evaluation.

SB 184 A

Authorizes court to initiate commitment proceedings for extremely dangerous person with mental illness if court determines that there is no substantial probability that defendant will gain or regain fitness to proceed.

SB 373 A

Expands public records law references that govern confidentiality of records maintained by Psychiatric Security Review Board.

SB 375 A

Directs court to inform defendant of potential commitment or conditional discharge prior to accepting plea of guilty except for insanity.

SB 581 A

Increases criminal penalties for offenses relating to use of unmanned aircraft system to interfere with aircraft.
