Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

- HB 3274 A
Requires eight percent of electricity sold in this state by each electric company that makes sales to 25,000 or more retail electricity consumers to be generated by small-scale renewable energy facilities or certain biomass facilities.
- HB 2006
Appropriates moneys to Housing and Community Services Department for grants to support services for families seeking or needing housing that have low or very low incomes.
- HB 3419
Prohibits prosecuting attorney from conditioning plea offer on waiver of specified rights, eligibilities and legal challenges.
- HCR 34
Expresses support for continued coordination and collaboration between Oregon and China.
- HCR 35
Recognizes 2019 as International Year of the Salmon and expresses support for associated global initiative affirming importance of wild salmon.
- HJR 5
CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4-22-2019 AGENDA: Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to remove gender-specific references to public officials and replace with gender-neutral references to public officials.
