Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

- SB 419
Applies retroactive to January 1, 2009, Oregon Life and Health Insurance Guaranty Association's \$300,000 liability limit for long term care insurance.
- SB 534 B
Requires local governments to allow single-family dwellings within urban growth boundary of city with population greater than 10,000 in residential lots platted and zoned for such uses.
- SB 582 A
Authorizes Governor to enter into agreement with another state for purposes of cross-jurisdictional coordination and enforcement of marijuana-related businesses and cross-jurisdictional delivery of marijuana items.
- SCR 32
Congratulates Congregation Neveh Shalom on its 150th anniversary.
- SCR 34
Commends public and private entities and first responders for their prompt and effective response to Santiam Park Fire.

Possible Work Session

- SB 854 A
Directs professional licensing boards, in certain circumstances, to accept individual taxpayer identification number or other federally-issued identification number in lieu of Social Security number on applications for issuance or renewal of authorization to practice occupation or profession.
- SB 855 A
Directs professional licensing boards to study manner in which persons who are immigrants or refugees become authorized to practice occupation or profession.
- HB 2266
Requires Oregon Health Policy Board to study changes in health care coverage in Oregon since implementation of Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and report results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to health.
