SB 854

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/4/2019 AGENDA: Directs professional licensing boards, in certain circumstances, to accept individual taxpayer identification number or other federally-issued identification number in lieu of Social Security number on applications for issuance or renewal of authorization to practice occupation or profession.

SB 855

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/4/2019 AGENDA: Directs professional licensing boards to develop pathways to licensure, certification or other authorization to practice occupation or profession for specified persons.

SB 471

CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/4/2019 AGENDA: Requires prospective contractor to state in bid or proposal for public contract whether and extent to which prospective contractor will use conflict minerals in performing public contract and whether prospective contractor's disclosures, policies, practices and procedures with respect to procuring conflict minerals comply with Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development's Due Diligence Guidance for Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from Conflict-Affected and High-Risk Areas.

SB 716

Requires retail seller or provider of essential goods and services to accept offer to pay by cash from retail buyer for purchase of goods or services.

SB 443

Requires use of headlights at all times.

SB 34

Amends industrial site readiness program to allow Oregon Business Development Department to enter into tax reimbursement arrangements for eligible site preparation costs with private owners.

SB 419

Applies retroactive to January 1, 2009, Oregon Life and Health Insurance Guaranty Association's \$300,000 liability limit for long term care insurance.

SB 372

Reduces period in which towers must provide notice to owners and lienholders of vehicle after towing vehicle.

SB 410

Eliminates Department of Consumer and Business Services regulation of recreational vehicle construction.

SB 240
